Contact the organisation directly. Do not use the numbers or address in the message – use the details from their official website.

Fraudsters put a lot of effort into making fake messages look real, report it by forwarding for FREE to 7726.

Number 4 of the 12 frauds of Christmas – Conveyancing Fraud

Criminals are targeting home buyers and sellers with payment diversion scams.

Follow this advice to protect yourself.

- Agree on how bank details will be shared at the start of the process.
- If in doubt, stop and verify any payment information directly with your solicitor.
- Secure your email with a strong password and two-step verification.
