Drug Offences - issues with the smell of Cannabis wafting onto neighbouring properties. Issues with people dealing drugs in your areas.	We have spoken to the public to obtain intelligence of known areas of concern. Thank you. Patrols have increased in those areas.
Anti-Social Behaviour - Hot spot patrols on areas of concern. Working with shop keepers / businesses- to ensure that there are no anti-social behaviour issues	Patrolling the hot-spot areas of concern on a more regular basis.
