A delivery driver’s motorbike was stolen, but the owner was able to track its location using an AirTag fitted to the vehicle. Working alongside local police, this information helped guide officers to the location, and the bike was successfully recovered and returned to its rightful owner.

This incident highlights the value of security measures such as tracking devices and CCTV, which can play a vital role in locating stolen property and supporting investigations.



Officers have been addressing ongoing anti-social behaviour, nuisance issues, and suspicious activity linked to a local address. Following repeated incidents, a full closure order has now been granted, and we hope this will significantly reduce ASB and prevent future crime in the area.



During the investigation, officers executed a Section 23 Misuse of Drugs Act warrant. A male was arrested and charged with handling stolen goods, and a number of weapons—including knives and adapted offensive items—were recovered.

Officers conducted a stop and search on an individual late at night on Kew Road after establishing sufficient grounds. During the search, the individual was found in possession of cannabis.

The substance was seized, and the matter was dealt with by way of an out-of-court disposal, in line with current policing guidelines.



While on patrol along Mortlake Road, officers identified a vehicle showing as uninsured on police systems. After locating a safe place, the vehicle was stopped.

Checks revealed that temporary insurance had been obtained shortly before the stop, during the time the vehicle was being followed.

The driver was reported for the offence and dealt with by way of a Traffic Offence Report (TOR).



During the early hours of a recent patrol, officers observed a van being driven erratically, without rear lights, and crossing road markings. Due to concerns for public safety, officers followed the vehicle with the intention of stopping it in a safe location.

The vehicle then made a sudden turn into a nearby cul-de-sac. When spoken to, occupants provided inconsistent accounts about their journey and reasons for being in the area.

Their behaviour, combined with the time of night and the circumstances, raised further suspicion. Both individuals were detained under relevant powers, and a search of the vehicle resulted in the discovery of items linked to suspected theft offences.



Officers were called to an address following reports of an individual making threats to harm themselves while appearing to use Class A drugs during a live online stream. Upon attendance, officers secured the scene and conducted enquiries, leading to the recovery of two firearms, a number of weapons and suspected drugs.

Appropriate action was taken to safeguard those involved and remove dangerous items from the community. This incident highlights the importance of responding swiftly to both welfare concerns and potential criminal activity.
