Patrols

During the month of June, we were on patrol in the community for a total of 98 hours 45 minutes.



Community engagement/events/meetings

Friday Lates:

This month saw the return of the 'Friday Lates' events in the Carfax. Organised by Horsham District Council and Food Rocks Markets, the events take place every Friday night from 6pm to 8pm throughout June, July and August at the Horsham Carfax Bandstand.

This year has seen us being more involved with these events, with regular attendance from ourselves, we work closely with our partner agencies and event organisers to ensure everyone enjoys their time whilst out in the community.



Dungeons & Dragons Club:

Our Dungeons & Dragons Club evenings, in partnership with 4TheYouth, is continuing. We have seen new young people joining each week and regulars returning. There is still space available for more young people to join this club. We have had a large increase of players recently and the club is successfully expanding. Our club will not be running over the summer holidays period and will restart in September.

We continue to stay in close contact with Horsham Market and speak with the market stall holders. West Sussex Fire and Rescue Service Safety Meeting:

We held our WSFRS Safety Meeting in Albery House again this month. This gives us an opportunity to talk about buildings and places that potentially could be of concern. A series of locations were raised. We fed back hotspots to WSFRS where people are using BBQ's and creating open fires. This meeting is essential for sharing information with each other.

Sussex Police and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

Sussex Police:

As Neighbourhood Wardens we have regularly patrolled with our Police Community Support Officers (PCSO's) and Neighbourhood Policing Team Police Constables (PC's). We continue to share Information with them and complete dedicated Joint patrols over the summer period, focusing on hotspots where ASB has been reported.

Anti-social behaviour:

This month, we continued to focus on areas reported by members of the public, identifying locations where Anti-social behaviour is higher than expected. Working in partnership with West Sussex Fire and Rescue Service and Sussex Police, providing advice and education to both young people and adults.

Youth engagement:

We have continued our work this month, in conjunction with 4theYouth, to access some of the young people who may be struggling and for them to get to know us. It has been a great opportunity to get to know some of these young people.

Vulnerable residents:

In June, we have been in contact with seven members of our community who are potentially vulnerable. We continue to signpost to support and ensure that services are working with these residents.

Signposting:

We had 72 conversations described as 'Signposting' this month. This can be anything from our local foodbanks and community fridge to reporting abandoned trolleys. During our foot patrols we spend a lot of time discussing with residents the support and resources available to them. Please see our resource page for the services we regularly signpost to.
