1. What's Happening In Your Area

Drugs – Ongoing core priority - Intelligence – We continue to review and act on drugs intelligence. For operational and data protection reasons we are unable to give specific details of locations / premises or persons that we are currently investigating. We have been working with other agencies to tackle individuals of concern linked to drug misuse.

We ask that you **report any concerns** around drugs misuse that you have. You may have information that adds to an ongoing concern, and this can really help when we apply for Warrants. You can speak to us at Hornsea Police Station in confidence or alternatively report anonymously via 'CrimeStoppers' at https://crimestoppers-uk.org/

One vehicle has been seized, and a Misuse of Drugs Act warrant has been executed. A further arrest has been made for drug driving and other driving offences. Another suspect was arrested for possession of a controlled drug with intent to supply which is still under investigation.

Local Residential Homes – Ongoing Liaison

Hornsea officers continue with weekly drop-in sessions to several of our care establishments within the town. A proportion of reported crimes relate to individuals who may be suffering a mental health episode. It is our intention to reduce incidents of reported missing persons and potential offending by engaging with staff and residents at the earliest opportunity.

Over the past few months there has been a decrease in recorded crime at three of our residential establishments

ASB - Halloween and Bonfire Night

Operation Topaz is a seasonal initiative focused on preventing and tackling antisocial behaviour, particularly around Halloween and Bonfire Night. It forms part of a broader strategy to enhance public safety during high-risk periods and transitions into Operation Yuletide as the festive season approaches.

We will be increasing patrols in the town centre and other locations linked to ASB.

Our ongoing work with local schools continues to address the issue of ASB and the impact it has on communities.

HumberTalking

Humber Talking is still being undertaken in the North Holderness area.

We will be speaking with householders on their doorstep however if you would rather participate online and highlight any issues you think the Police should be dealing with, please visit the website.

What is Humber talk?

3. Crimes of note

Detailed crime and ASB data for your area can be obtained by visiting www.police.uk and entering your postcode into the 'What's happening in your area?' section.

During September 2025 we received two reports of vehicle crime.

On the 28th a vehicle was stopped for traffic related offences on Southorpe Road. A male person was arrested for possessing a controlled drug. Crime number 25*136099 refers.

Last month we reported on a daytime **Burglary on College Gardens** (Crime number 25*122352) where items had been taken from a garage. We are pleased to report that this has **not been a Burglary** and that the items reported as stolen had been collected by a family member.

4. General information and Appeals

02/09/2025 – Appeal for information – Surron Bikes - We have received information that there are two Surron style electric bikes that travel from the Hornsea area towards Cowden on an evening.

They have been seen to go into Cowden Holiday Park. The two riders were wearing dark clothing and balaclavas.

07/09/2025 – Rural Task Force locate stolen vehicle - This vehicle was stolen from a farm last night. RTF Officers located it within 6 hours of it being stolen and reunited it with its owners.

13/09/2025 – Night Patrols by Rural Task Force – East Riding - Over the last three nights the RTF have been actively patrolling over 1000 square miles of the East Riding in an effort to deter Rural Criminals. Numerous vehicles stopped and Hotspot areas patrolled.

On the 18th officers located an abandoned Horsebox that was found to be reported stolen. It has now been returned to its owner.


22/09/2025 – Rural Task Force - Zero tolerance response to illegal hare coursing following Sunday's #OpGalileo day of action. Collaborative working between various policing teams, police helicopter & the farm watch community resulted in 4 x arrests, 1 x vehicle & 6 x dogs seized.

23/09/2025 - End of the line for Bradford to Bridlington drug dealers

A pair of drug peddlers involved in the supply and distribution of approximately £70,000 worth of class A drugs from Bradford to

Bridlington have been sentenced to a combined total of twelve years and three months behind bars.

Louis Titre, 30-years-old, of Winscar Avenue, Bradford, and Darren Worgan, 41years-old, of Victoria Road, Bridlington, were sentenced at Hull Crown Court today (Tuesday, 23 September 2025) after admitting their roles in a drugs network that trafficked heroin, cocaine and crack cocaine across county lines.

27/09/2025 - Hornsea Police Station - Cycle Marking Event

29/09/2025 – APPEAL - Officers investigating a report of a **Caravan Theft on Lighthouse Road in Flamborough** on Monday 15 September are appealing for help to locate this vehicle.

It is believed at around 7.40pm that a silver and white Buccaneer Barracuda caravan with the registration CR12DAZ was stolen from a field on Lighthouse Road in Flamborough and witnessed being towed by the driver of a Black Toyota HiLux in the direction of Grindale.

Following lines of enquiries, we are now releasing CCTV images of the vehicle we believe could be linked to our ongoing investigation.

Scam awareness Hornsea – Insulation phone scam

PCSO Roberts would like to inform you of a current scam having been reported in Hornsea.

The scammer calls you and when you answer they say that they are an engineering company who have been looking at records and that your property does not have adequate insulation, they say if you do not get their insulation your house will suffer from black mould, the caller tries to use pressure to get you to agree to the work.

If you receive a call like this, please do not agree to any work without checking up on the company cold calling you.

September Operation Spotlight

Throughout September and October 2025, officers from our Roads Policing Unit will be joining forces across the country as part of the National Police Chief's Council (NPCC) campaign to target young drivers and riders.

Working together with road safety partners, the aim of the campaign is to focus on the key contributors in collisions which involve young drivers between 17 and 24-years-old:

- Speeding
- Drink and drug driving
- Mobile phone usage
- Not wearing a seatbelt

Historically, September and October typically see an increase in fatal and serious collisions, with more commuter traffic on the road as people go back to work, college, and university, as well as children returning to school after the summer break.

At this time of year, the weather is also starting to take a turn and there will be higher amounts and more frequent rainfall. October specifically sees a peak due to the half term period where more people will be travelling on unfamiliar roads for days out and holidays or short breaks.

Nationally, there were 4,922 people killed or seriously injured on roads in September and October between 2018 and 2022, as a result of the 'fatal four' contributing factors.

Op Yokohama motorbikes continue to tackle dangerous driving and vehicle theft.

Operation Yokohama is an initiative led by our Roads Policing Team, following advanced training in off-road riding combined with pursuit tactics.


This specialist training equips officers to safely pursue offenders who use motorbikes to commit crime and evade arrest.

The motorbikes can be used on both public roads and off-road terrain, allowing the team to continue pursuits into areas where previously, they could not follow.

The introduction of these motorbikes comes in response to a rise in offenders using motorcycles to commit vehicle theft and associated antisocial behaviour.

Dangerous riding poses serious dangers to the public and will not be tolerated on the roads and in the open spaces in our communities.

Operation Yokohama is focused on removing these risks from our roads, making our communities safer, one pursuit at a time.

If you have information regarding those responsible for fraud, please contact Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.



HMRC's top tips for avoiding scams are:

- Recognise the signs genuine organisations like banks and HMRC will never contact you out of the blue to ask for your PIN, password or bank details.
- Stay safe don't give out private information, reply to text messages, download attachments or click on links in emails you weren't expecting.
- Take action forward suspicious emails claiming to be from HMRC to phishing@hmrc.gsi.gov.uk and texts to 60599, or contact Action Fraud on 0300 123 2040 to report any suspicious calls or use their online fraud reporting tool.
- HMRC Debt management teams do contact members of the public by phone about paying outstanding debts.
- If a customer (or agent) isn't confident that the call is from HMRC, we will ask them to call back.
 Depending on the circumstances and to give the customer confidence it is actually HMRC calling, information may be disclosed to the caller which only HMRC is party to
- Calls from the majority of HMRC offices will leave caller identification data, i.e. the number the caller has used to contact you from

Never click on a link and if in doubt make your own independent enquiries.
