Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you. #YouSaidWeDid

You Said	We did
Burglary has been raised as a priority by residents, this will primarily be residential but there are a few commercial premises in the NH19 area as well.	Burglary and Vehicle Crime hotspot patrols have been conducted with CCTV and house to house enquiries.
General anti-social behaviour has been raised as a priority by local residents, this includes nuisance by youths at the Meridian Leisure Park.	The beat team attended the Braunstone Town Fete, our patrols were not just limited to the event however. Meridian Leisure Park has had some issues recently and we included patrolling there and the wider greenspace around Mossdale Meadows. There was a group of youngsters that thought it was a good idea to hang around the edge of the event with their E-bikes. Police left the area with one of their E-bikes (which was actually an E-Motorbike) after the rider Failed to Stop but was then cornered and arrested for that offence (face drop, attitude change) and taken home. £400 of bike crushed.
Road Safety and Speeding has been raised as priority by local residents. Road Safety include off road motorbikes, speeding and other general road safety issues raised a priority by Neighbourhood Link	EMH are looking into potential changes to the layout of the area to help reduce the number of motorbikes traveling through the green space in the area of Burdet Close. Braunstone Town Council are looking into potentially supporting this too.

News

The beat team were invited to Peverel Court by residents of Burdet Close last month. The area has had some troubling times over the last year with numerous calls to the area. It has been nice to be invited to an event by the residents of Peverel Court that is in recognition of all the agencies efforts to drive down anti-social behaviour and crime. We've completed some surveys on Neighbourhood Link to try and capture any further concerns whilst we were there, but it was nice just to be present so that the residents could pass on their thanks in person. So who are the Partner Agencies? East Midlands Homes, Blaby Police (past/present beat teams, our response teams and Specialist Support Directorate [Firearms and Dog Officers]), the County Council Local Area Coordinator, Blaby District Council Chair Person Peter Bedford and Local Shop Employees. But what are we being thanked for? Youths gathering outside Peverel Court were causing the vulnerable residents harassment. We identified the perpetrators and either sent out Warning Letters or visited them. This issue resurfaces from time to time and it is mostly resolved from this low level intervention. EMH have removed fencing that was part of the cause for the congregations. Taking action against Fly Tipping EMH regularly clear the mess left by some residents on Hastings Walk. Police have spoken to the suspected persons involved, who have been strongly advised to cease their actions. BDC have shortlisted the location to focus on proactive enforcement. EMH have worked with residents to form a litter picking group and they have sent out letters in conjunction with Blaby District Council. A resident of Peverel Court was Evicted, police provided information and accompanied Officers from EMH to evict the tenant, whom was causing problems in the housing scheme following their conviction at court for breaching the terms of their tenancy. A resident of the flats on Kingsway has also been evicted. This followed months of ongoing ASB from the resident and associated crimes, including the resident brandishing a knife and using it on a residents visitor. Following the arrest and subsequent prison time, EMH have successfully gained possession of the property at court.
