What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and are prioritising the following.

Priority 1. Road Safety

You said: Speeding vehicles are a concern for you across multiple locations around the beat and issues with weight restrictions being breached.

What we are going to do. Visible traffic calming, speed monitoring enforcement. Monitoring of weight restrictions.

Priority 2. Farming Equipment Thefts and Rural Crime

You said: You are concerned about rural crime across the beat and the theft of farming equipment which has a huge impact on daily farming tasks.

What we are going to do. We will continue patrols in isolated rural areas and visit victims of crime. We will also target those patrols based on current crime trends and intelligence.

Priority 3. Antisocial Behaviour

You Said: You are concerned about Antisocial Behaviour (ASB) This new priority is based on recent incident reviews, ongoing investigations, and your feedback.

What we are going to do. Patrols have been carried out over the Halloween period and will continue as we head into the bonfire night period. Engagement with local children to deter them from any ASB. Where perpetrators can be identified, the incremental approach will be utilised.

October Road Safety

Reports received and incidents attended.

13/10 - Road Traffic Collision (RTC) Normanton—single vehicle RTC resulting in serious injury.

18/10 Allegation of Bad Driving (AOBD) Melton Road, Waltham on the Wolds – footage reviewed and no offences.

17/10 19:10 -RTC - Queen Street, Bottesford. Still under investigation

20/10 – AOBD, A607 Waltham on the Wolds. Notice of intended prosecution for tailgating being sent under rule 167 of the Highway Code.

25/10 13:00 - AOBD - A52 Bottesford - still under investigation.

25/10 – 11:11 AOBD – Cuckoo Hill, Stapleford – Notice of intended prosecution sent for driving without due care and attention following an overtake on a single track road.

30/10 – 2 Vehicle RTC Hose Lane, Long Clawson resulting in slight injury.

On the morning of Wednesday 8th, following feedback from the community speed monitoring was carried out in Sproxton on the entrance to the village on Buckminster Road between 09:00-09:23. 41 vehicles were observed and all was within the 30 MPH speed limit.

Tuesday 28th, Traffic Calming was carried out on Goadby Road between 16:10 and 16:30 and Station Road in Bottesford 17:00-17:30.

BOTTESFORD ANTISOCIAL BEHAVIOUR (ASB)

Following recent feedback and ongoing concerns, our third policing priority now focuses on tackling Antisocial Behaviour (ASB), particularly in areas where incidents have increased. One such location is Queen Street, which has experienced a noticeable rise in ASB over recent weeks.

We have been actively investigating these reports, and as a result, two alleged perpetrators have been identified in connection with the ongoing issues in Queen Street. A visit has been conducted at their home address, and they have now been placed on the incremental approach – a structured intervention process aimed at preventing further incidents and encouraging positive behaviour

We understand the impact ASB can have on the community, and we are committed to taking firm but fair action. Our approach includes:

- Continued monitoring of ASB hotspots
- Working closely with local partners and residents
- Providing support to victims and affected communities
- Engaging with individuals involved to prevent escalation

Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Incremental Approach

Advice - Letter/Verbal Issued to highlight incidents of ASB which have raised concern. A person can enter the Incremental Approach at any Out of Warning Letter Issued to highlight a person's ongoing o more serious involvement in ASB and Court Stage dependant on the severity of request for this behaviour to stop. the incident **Acceptable Behaviour Contract** Issued to address a person's ASB and to support them in stopping this behaviour.

Out of Court Stage

A civil remedy intended to stop or prevent individuals engaging in ASB before incidents escalate.

Civil Injunction

Closure Notice/ Order Community Protection Notice Designed to allow the Police and Local Authority to quickly close a premises being used, or likely to be used to commit nuisance or disorder

Court order issued against a person involved in persistent ASB to protect the public from harassment, alarm or distress

Criminal Behaviour Order

Other possible sanctions

Demoted tenancies Possession Order Injunction against unlawful use of premises Exclusion Order and power o arrest

In extreme person may enter at the Court Stage of the Incremental Approach
