Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Fern Spellman who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of Police officers and Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

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Children in Warwickshire help to shape our new mission statement committing to child-centred policing.

In collaboration with the Warwickshire Safeguarding Children Partnership, we've launched a new child mission statement. This sets out our commitment to delivering child-centred, compassionate and evidence-led policing, ensuring we help to protect children in Warwickshire from harm, we listen to them properly and we support them early and at every opportunity.

We know that children may not always feel able to speak out, talk to police officers or contribute to investigations because they're scared, traumatised or exploited. We want to safeguard children, protect them and pursue the people who seek to harm them, without putting more pressure on young victims.

The mission features landmark 'CHILD' principles for everyone who works with children as part of their role at Warwickshire Police. We've shaped these principles using national best practice and importantly, these principles are based on the views and feedback of young people themselves thanks to Local Authority partner's 'Child friendly Warwickshire' workshops.

It embeds the existing force commitment to continuous improvement, learning from safeguarding reviews, inspections, audits and feedback from children, families and partners to strengthen practice and outcomes. It sees us continuing to work effectively with partner agencies across Warwickshire, ensuring we remain focused, transparent and accountable in all our work to protect children.

Deputy Chief Constable Ben Smith said:

"Our aim is to deliver excellent child-centred policing as standard. This is an essential part of our force vision to serve and protect communities in Warwickshire.

Central to the mission therefore is our "no compromise" approach to child protection, which means we put children first, and every opportunity we have to interact with a child is an opportunity to positively impact their life."
