#### Our New Beat Priorities for the next 3 Months:

#### 1) & Op PedalFast – Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) involving E-Scooters and E-Bikes

Concerns have been raised about the misuse of e-scooters and e-bikes in public spaces, particularly in parks and open areas.

- We will increase visible patrols in hotspot areas to deter dangerous riding and anti-social behaviour.
- We will engage with local communities and partners to address concerns and promote responsible use.
- We will share clear guidance on the legal use of e-scooters and e-bikes and encourage reporting of misuse.

#### 2) Car Cruising activity in and around Ashby Town Centre

This remains a concern for residents and visitors, with ongoing reports of cars racing and gathering in car parks.

- We will continue enforcement against those driving dangerously or causing ASB.
- We will work with landowners to reduce opportunities for gatherings through crime prevention measures.
- We will educate young drivers about the risks and consequences of irresponsible driving.

#### 3) Road Safety in and around Packington

Improving road safety in Packington and nearby villages is a key priority.

- We will increase patrols to monitor speeding and dangerous driving, especially in areas highlighted by residents.
- We will engage with the community to identify specific concerns and target our efforts effectively.
- We will support traffic calming initiatives and promote safe driving through education and enforcement.

## What we have done #yousaidwedid

  Working together for a safer, stronger community
- 1) ASB in the parks and open public spaces in Ashby Town Centre during the summer period.

#### WE DID:

Throughout the summer, we've taken proactive steps to reduce ASB and improve the experience of residents and visitors:

- Increased Patrols: Officers have maintained a visible presence in hotspot areas, particularly parks and open spaces, to deter ASB and provide reassurance.
- **Community Engagement**: We've worked closely with local partners and community groups to address concerns and share updates.
- **Crime Prevention Advice**: Through social media and face-to-face engagement, we've promoted practical tips to prevent ASB and encouraged reporting.

#### 2) Car Cruising activity in and around Ashby Town Centre

#### WE DID:

Car cruising remains a concern, and we've taken a multi-pronged approach to tackle it:

- **Targeted Enforcement**: Action has been taken against individuals driving dangerously or causing ASB with their vehicles.
- Several Section 59 notices have been issued to drivers found operating vehicles in an anti-social manner.
- **K** Crime Prevention Support: We've worked with landowners to design out issues in car parks and gathering spots.
- **Driver Education**: Young drivers have been engaged and educated on the risks and consequences of reckless driving.

#### WHY THIS REMAINS A BEAT PRIORITY:

Despite ongoing efforts, car cruising continues to be a problem—particularly along key routes such as the A511 and the main stretch of road from Nottingham Road through to Shellbrook. These areas frequently attract gatherings and anti-social behaviour, causing issues to both road users and the wider community. We're committed to maintaining this priority to ensure public safety and reduce disruption for local residents.

#### 3) Tackling Drug Misuse on and around the Meredith & Drew Estate, Ashby

#### **WE DID-**

We've prioritized tackling drug-related activity to protect residents and reduce harm:

- **Visible Patrols**: Regular patrols in known hotspot areas have helped deter illegal activity and reassure the community.
- **Community Intelligence:** We've encouraged residents to share concerns, helping us focus resources where they're needed most.
- Decisive Action: Arrests and interventions have been made using all appropriate legal measures to disrupt drug misuse and safeguard the neighborhood.

#### Community Update: Fatal Collision in Ashby-de-la-Zouch

We are saddened to report that a pedestrian has died following a collision in Ashbyde-la-Zouch.

Police were called to the junction of Hill Street and Kilwardby Street just after 9:30pm on Monday, 15 September, following a report of a collision involving a silver Vauxhall Insignia and a 79-year-old man.

The pedestrian was taken to hospital but tragically passed away from his injuries on Thursday, 18 September.

A 33-year-old man arrested in connection with the incident has since been released on bail.

Officers are continuing to appeal for witnesses or anyone with dashcam, doorbell, or CCTV footage that may assist the investigation. If you were in the area or have relevant footage, please come forward.
