Update so far...

Having started my role as Rural & Wildlife Crime Partnerships Manager mid December 2024, I've taken the remaining Winter months to meet the Teams and some of the Rural Community across our County to understand how we tackle Rural Crime, we're different to neighbouring forces and have some incredibly knowledgeable Wildlife Crime Officers and Rural Beat Managers who are truly passionate about their local Community and the people who live in it

There's always work to be done and above I've highlighted some of the things I've been able to implement since joining, as a civilian with a wealth of knowledge in management, organisation and technology I can apply my strategic approach to improving efficiency, officer skills, cross-border communication and internal understanding of Rural and Wildlife specific issues, with the help of our longstanding partners

















A bit more about what's happening Internally

- 22 new Wildlife Crime Officers have started their National Wildlife Crime Unit led Training package to be come specially trained officers to deal with issues such as Hunting with Hounds, Badger crime, the illegal trade of endangered species (CITES) and bird of prey crime to name just a few.
- I have launched an internal Rural
 Crime Sharepoint for the entire
 Force to access relevant
 information on Rural updates,
 resources and provide a seasonal
 weekly update to the Control
 Room on countryside matters
 arising with the changing seasons
- Training continues to add to our existing teams and officers able to deploy the force Quad Bike, alongside 5 additional riders to join the off road bike team later this year, increasing our off road capability. The Quad will be focused in th vast open countryside of the North and East of the County, soon deployable from Harworth, Ollerton and Newark
- Utilising the National Rural Crime
 Unit Channel and reinstatement of
 both Regional Intelligence
 meetings and cross-border
 operations with neighbouring
 forces to strengthen relationships
 and focus on problem areas where
 we are aware communities feel
 vunerable due to their individual
 landscape
- Training Day supported by the Angling Trust and Environment Agency to be held in May where officers and staff will gain detailed knowledge of the laws and restrictions around fishing in rivers, lakes, ponds and streams
- Off Road Bike Team re-structure to improve internal processes ensuring bikes can be out on patrol as often as possible, with local Beat Teams on pro-active deployments in areas not normally accessible to Police



#Horsewatch

The force Horsewatch scheme had been sadly shelved due to staff changes when I joined so as a horse rider myself it seemed the right thing to do to re-invigorate our previous scheme and bring it back to life

- Horsewatch officers now available across the County who have specialised knowledge and resources for dealing with all forms of equine related crime
- Control Room tagging of Equine issues to ensure concerns are properly investigated
- Availability of the Dashcam App
 https://dashcamupload.notts.police.uk/ where riders
 with footage containing a VRM (number plate) can
 upload their footage for investigation and action by a
 specialised team
- Events calendar of Yard/Public Meetings with our partners to share vital contact information and ideas for the future of Horsewatch in Notts Police
- Signage and trailer vinyls available
- Headcollars in a 'Bucket Grab' to be introduced to all Rural and semi-rural stations for dealing with loose equines on roads and public areas

Please have your say

I understand you may feel that reporting something in the past hasn't amounted to any visible action. I understand you feel there's nothing we can do about a situation you witness. However reporting is the single biggest thing you can do to help our teams reduce Rural Crime

- If you are a member of a Rural Whatsapp group and you see something
 you feel should be reported to Police, please encourage that user to
 report it, without intelligence we cannot build a pattern of what's
 happening in your area. This is the single most useful thing you can do to
 help
- Report suspicious activity, if something doesn't look right, if someone is on your land without permission, if someone is riding along a footpath or bridleway and you're not sure they should be, if you have felt intimidated or threatened by the behaviour of others whilst in a rural or isolated area, please report it
- If you are **concerned about a fellow farmer**, landowner, neighbour, colleague, partner or **young person**, there are organisations who can help you and them to get access to the support they might need
