Three Main Priorities

The three main priorities your neighbourhood team are currently focusing on aside from reported incidents and other on-going matters are:

Theft of Motor Vehicles

Work has gone into both preventative measures and the investigation of Stolen Vehicles - with several recovered this month alone.

Anti-Social Behaviour at the Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre

Over the Summer Holidays, you may have seen more proactive patrols at the Beaumont shopping centre. This is due to potential Anti-Social Behaviour occurring and to work in partnership with staff and to help the public enjoying the location.

Knife Crime Reduction

A National Increase in knife crime has been identified and the neighbourhood team are both proactively targeting those that cause most harm and educating young people around the dangers of knife crime.



Speeding OP conducted

Local officers were informed whilst conducting neighbourhood consultations that speeding was a concern, along Bennion Road. So local officers carried out a check in multiple spots on the stretch of road. Those who were not following the speed limits were spoken to and advice given. '#You said, We did'



Engagement at Loros Fundraising event

Local officers and PCSOs attended the annual LOROS fundraising event along with partner agencies, such as the ambulance service. We engaged with local residents and others who attended the event and showed them what police carry in their vehicles and spoke about crime prevention advice and how to safeguard yourself.
