Door-to-door Sales – Be Safe and Secure, say NO to doorstep callers

- Ensure your back door is locked before you go to the front door
- Use your door bar / chain / viewer before opening the door
- Arrange appointments for callers
- Always ask for id and check it carefully. If need be ring the company to check identity

If in doubt KEEP THEM OUT

Report unwanted callers to Trading Standards or Consumer Helpline on 0808 223 1133 and suspicious actions to police on 101 or 999 in an emergency.

Parking near Schools

Since the start of this school term, the team have received complaints regarding motorists parking on pavements, kerbs, yellow line restrictions and "School Keep Clear" zones at different schools around the beat area we cover, plus with schools sending messages to parents about parking near schools.

We understand that school dropping off and picking up can be quite stressful and difficult at times, but when it comes to dropping off and picking up, please allow more time to make your journey and keep kerbs, pavements, yellow lines and "School Keep Clear" unobstructed as they are there to keep everyone safe!

Anti-Social Behaviour

ASB is behaviour that causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm and distress and can come in many different forms including; Noise, Criminal Danage, graffiti, vandalism, Intimidation, harassment, threats, litter, dog fouling, fly tipping, Deliberate fire setting, Nuisance vehicles, Drunken, rowdy behaviour or drug misuse, Hate behaviour

A Roads Policing officer will then review your footage and contact you if any criminal proceedings are to be undertaken on the back of your submission or if any further information is required from you to ensure that a thorough investigation, if necessary.
