Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Jake Kibblewhite who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sgt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. The Alcester SNT currently consists of Police officers and Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

Your chance to learn about knife crime and surrender your knife.

Next week, we will be supporting Operation Sceptre, a national initiative focused on tackling knife crime through enforcement, prevention, education and community engagement.

Throughout the week, knife surrender bins will be available at all our police station front counters, giving people the opportunity to surrender knives safely and anonymously. There will be no questions asked, and no personal details required — individuals can simply attend, place the knife in the bin, and leave. We're committed to reducing knife crime in Warwickshire.

Each knife surrendered is one less weapon that could be used to cause harm. By removing knives from our communities, we reduce the risk of serious injury and help make our neighbourhoods safer for everyone.

Throughout the week, we will be promoting the Behind Every Blade campaign. This campaign was designed with the support of young people in Warwickshire. The campaign highlights the potential impact of carrying a knife with a view to making people think twice about it and encourage anyone with concerns about someone carrying a knife to report these.
