PCSO Oleh has been out and about engaging with the local community in Humberstone Park, as the summer months continue, we're receiving increased reports of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in our parks and green spaces. PCSO Oleh and the team is actively patrolling the area, speaking with residents and dealing with anyone appropriately causing disruption. We're here to make sure everyone can enjoy the outdoors safely and respectfully.





PC Darbar and PC Woolley carried out patrols across hotspot areas on the Coleman beat. During their shift: 3 males were stop searched for drugs. Later on, officers discovered sharp weapon and drugs hidden nearby. Safe to say, these won't be going back to their owner! Police patrol notices have now been placed to let everyone know: We're out, we're visible, and we're watching.

"The Police Will Take You Away" - Let's Rethink. PC Wicks and PCSO Cook attended a local school Mela. It was a fantastic event, but something PC Wicks and PCSO Cook noticed left them concerned. They heard several parents saying things like, "Behave or the Police will take you away," and saw children who were too scared to come near them. When a child goes missing, it's the Police who are called. And it's officers who go out—day or night—to search and bring that child home safely. This might seem harmless in the moment—but imagine how frightening it would be for a child who gets lost, and the person searching for them is someone they've been taught to fear. We want children to feel safe approaching us, not scared. Please help us build that trust by encouraging positive conversations about the role of Police in our communities. Together, we can make sure every child knows we're here to help.





Teamwork in Action! During a shift, PC Darbar and PC Taylor responded to reports of an abandoned vehicle on Elizabeth Street. Upon arrival, they found two males inside the car. A quick search revealed one male was in possession of cannabis and further checks showed, one male was wanted on warrant. The other was wanted for robbery. With the fantastic support from PC Woolley, PCSO Trantom and PC Shaffi, both males were arrested and transported to custody.
