Drug Offences is seen is a high priority for the residents of the Fosse Villages. As of July it has been raised as a new priority taking over previous concerns.	Intelligence has been received in relation to drug offences in Stoney Stanton. The local beat team are aware and a visit is planned.
General Anti-social behaviour and nuisance motorbikes has been raised a priority issue for residents of the Fosse Villages.	Officers visited Croft and Huncote as there was a report of motorbikes being ridden anti-socially, follow up enquires were conducted to identify those involved.

There has been an issue raised this month on Broughton Road, Croft. PCSO Keane has been liaising with the volunteers to conduct a speeding operation on my behalf.

And here we have the age-old question "why did the chicken cross the road?", who knows but he seemed to know where he was going. We found him sauntering across the road whilst out on enquiries. Earlier that same morning PC Jon, keeping with the animal theme attended a report of sheep in the road in the Sapcote area causing a danger to road users and itself. We are happy to report that the sheep was safe and sound and baaaack where it belonged.



PCSO Ryan visited Croft as there was a report of motorbikes being ridden anti-socially the previous week. We were unable to locate the riders at the time so we returned to do some follow up enquires, we are hoping to identify those involved so they can be dealt with appropriately.

A vehicle crashed into a garden wall of a property on Coventry Road in Sharnford, the vehicle came to a stop and 2 persons exited the vehicle, they retrieved a rucksack from the car and made off on foot. A fantastic member of the public followed the suspects and directed Officers in the direction of travel. Our dog was deployed and tracked down both suspects who were hiding in a ditch. The rucksack was also located having been dropped by the suspects. The bag contained a bottle of Nitrous Oxide, drugs were also located within the vehicle. The driver was arrested after testing positive for Cannabis and was further arrested for failing to provide whilst in Custody.


