

Community Engagement – A Visit to the Local Primary School

Crime Prevention Advice – Winter Burglaries

During the winter months, we often see a rise in burglaries. This is partly because homes contain expensive items, especially after Christmas. Here are some tips to help keep your property safe:

- **Avoid leaving packaging outside** Boxes from TVs, gaming consoles, or other high-value items can signal to criminals that you have new goods inside.
- **Secure doors and windows** Even when you're at home, make sure everything is locked.
- Use timers for lights A well-lit home can deter opportunistic thieves.

If you see **any suspicious activity**, please report it to the Police immediately. Your information could help prevent a crime.

E-Bikes and E-Scooters - Know the Law

E-bikes and e-scooters are popular gifts at Christmas, but please check the rules before using them:

- **E-scooters**: Currently, privately owned e-scooters cannot be used on public roads, pavements, or cycle lanes. They can only be used on private land with permission.
- **E-bikes**: To be road legal, they must meet specific requirements (such as having pedals and a motor limited to 250 watts with a maximum speed of 15.5 mph). If they don't meet these standards, they could be seized by Police.

Before gifting or riding, make sure you know the law to avoid fines or confiscation.
