#### **Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs**

Alcohol and drug driving | West Mercia Police

#### **Drink driving**

The legal alcohol limit in England, Wales and Northern Ireland for driving is 80 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood or 35 micrograms of alcohol per 100 millilitres of breath. In Scotland the limit is 50 milligrams of alcohol per 100 millilitres of blood or 22 micrograms of alcohol in 100 millilitres of breath.

There is no way to know how much you can drink and stay under the limit, since it can depend on your weight, age, metabolism, the amount of food you've eaten and other factors.

It's impossible to get alcohol out of your system quickly, it always takes time. A shower, a cup of coffee or other ways of 'sobering up' may make you feel better but won't remove the alcohol from your system.

If you've been out drinking, you may still be affected by alcohol the next day and could lose your licence if you drive and are still over the legal limit.

Alcohol affects everyone differently and any amount can impair your ability to drive. The only safe option is to avoid alcohol completely if you're driving as even 'just one drink' could put you over the limit.

If you're driving, don't drink any alcohol at all.

#### **Drug driving**

It's an offence to drive with any of 17 controlled drugs above a specified level in your blood. This includes <u>illegal and legally prescribed drugs</u>.

The limit set for each drug is different, and for illegal drugs the limits set are extremely low. They aren't zero to rule out any accidental exposure (e.g. from passive smoking).

You should always check with your doctor or pharmacist if you're unsure about whether your prescription or over-the-counter medication will affect your ability to drive.




# **Electric bikes**

Make sure you know the law before buying or riding an e-bike





Scan the QR code and get smart on e-bikes



Although e-scooters are available to buy, they are currently illegal to use on public roads, pavements, cycle lanes and pedestrian-only areas unless part of a legal e-scooter loan scheme. As there are no legal schemes in place in Herefordshire, Shropshire or Worcestershire, e-scooters can only be ridden on private land with the permission of the landowner.

E-scooters are currently classed as Personal
Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs) by the
Government and fall under the same laws and
regulations that apply to all motor vehicles in
terms of requiring insurance, tax, MOT, licence
and registration.

There is no mechanism in place at the moment to obtain any of these for e-scooters so as this requirement can't be met, their use in public areas is illegal, anyone found using them in public areas risks having the e-scooter seized by the police.

Keeping those who use our roads safe is a 24/7, year-round priority for us across Herefordshire, Shropshire and Worcestershire, with road safety sitting at the heart of Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion's West Mercia Safer Communities Plan.

In line with this we will be supporting 'Operation Dark Night', a national police lead operation focusing on keeping cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders safe during the darker months.

Cyclists, pedestrians and horse riders are also being encouraged to think about how visible they are to other road users, especially as the nights start to get darker and to consider wearing high visibility clothing and reflective material, to ensure they can be seen easily. Pedestrians are reminded to always use pedestrian crossings where possible, especially those taking new journeys to and from school. Cyclists should ensure their bike is in good working order and carries front and rear lights.
