Your Dedicated Neighbourhood Team (DNT) is a group of local Officers dedicated to serving your community. The team is made up of Officers based in your area, supported by the wider Policing family.



Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you.

You Said	We did
Priority 1:- Road Safety Concerns relating to Road Safety around parking, speeding or loud cars causing nuisance or motorbikes being ridden in an anti-social manner.	We have been made aware of certain areas on the beat that are suffering from speeding vehicles and we are looking to set up a speeding operation in the near future. We have been stop checking vehicles and seizing them where applicable under DVLA powers. Drivers who have been driving with no insurance have been dealt with and summonsed to court for the offence.
Priority 2:- Drug dealing We are always looking for opportunities to gather sufficient intelligence to enforce by way of drugs warrants.	We have been speaking with local residents who have concerns about drug dealing around the area and have been developing intel where possible.
Priority 3:- Anti-Social Behaviour	Where ASB has occurred reports have been made and identifiable perpetrators have been dealt with. We have been linking in with the local authorities to work together to solve problems around the area.

News

PC Nik has been out and about on foot patrols around the local parks and ASB hotspots on the beat that you told us about. It was lovely to meet and speak to so many residents on what was a lovely warm evening, no ASB was noted on that evening but we'd love to hear from you so we can continue to address this issue.

PC Tones and PCSO Reed attended a Road Traffic Collision on one shift, the driver was not named on the insurance policy and was on a provisional license.

PC Tones also stopped a vehicle that we had been made aware of that had no MOT, insurance or Tax.

The vehicle has been seized and the driver was issued a Traffic Offence Report (TOR) and will be summonsed to court.



PCSO Reed was out on patrol and came across a vehicle parked on the public highway. The vehicle was registered at SORN and was recovered under DVLA powers.



We want to raise awareness around vehicle crime and the steps you can take to protect your vehicle. Firstly double check your vehicle is locked, steering lock on, do not leave valuables in the car or on show and fit a steering lock to add additional security.

Listen for the locking noise, lights to flash and where fitted folding mirrors.



Over the coming weeks we will see celebrations for Halloween, Diwali and Bonfire Night and unfortunately at this time of the year there are individuals who use this occasion as an excuse to cause trouble for residents. It is essential to remember the importance of celebrating safely and respecting those

who choose to not take part. Remember....

- You must be 18 or over to purchase fireworks.
- For Halloween only visit properties with displays/pumpkins etc.
- There is a Midnight curfew for fireworks during Bonfire Night.
- There is a 1am curfew for fireworks during Diwali.
- Be kind to your neighbours especially with pets and choose to attend an organised display.
- Allow children to carry torches or glow sticks to allow drivers to see them.
- Finally, have fun, be respectful and stay safe.

PCSO Reed was at the Co-Op in Earl Shilton and the George Ward Centre in Barwell this month conducting beat surgeries. This is an opportunity for yourselves to come along and voice any concerns you have about the area you live and talk to local officers.


