Anti-Social Behaviour

Atherstone Safer Neighbourhood Team have been tackling Anti-Social Behaviour within the town.



With the help of NWBC CCTV department and retail radio, officers have been working hard to identify those causing ASB. 11 youths have been dealt with for ASB, shop thefts & criminal damage at the Queen Elizabeth School.

The team visited each home address and took the opportunity to speak with each parent / guardian. CCTV footage was shown which demonstrated the impact of their child's behaviour.

All the parents have been very supportive during visits and in some incidents compensation & apologises by the parents have been paid to the Injured party.

We will be continuing to monitor these incidents and deal with them appropriately. If you are experiencing ASB in the area, report this online, via 101 or use 999 in an emergency.



Continuing with Anti Social Behaviour, PCSO Emily Jenkins and PSCO Molly Snape performed late night patrols tackling areas involved in ASB including Hartshill Hayes!

School Engagement – Hartshill School

Arrest



A female was stopped in a vehicle by officers on Spon Lane, Grendon. The vehicle was observed by officers driving over the speed limit and weaving across carriageway.

The driver when stopped had an open can of cider in the vehicle and also a cannabis roll up in her in hand! Driver unsurprising was arrested for driving under the influence of drink and drugs

In a separate incident North Warwickshire SNT on patrol in Shuttington saw a male acting suspiciously in the village and was stop searched for drugs. The boxing club has been awarded CIMSPA registration and are currently looking into future projects including Female only boxing and Fitness sessions and an Art project with world renowned street artists. The coaches have been granted funding to get trained as PT coaches and will be creating a programme next year to develop the club into high schools in north Warwickshire to support schools and pupils and help to lower the exclusions rates of pupils and keep kids off the streets.





Whilst the North Warwickshire Police Boxing and Fitness club has been closed, the equipment has been upgraded. We have installed a new protective floor after a grant from the Chief Constable of Warwickshire Police, we then installed 4 new boxing bags and purchased equipment after grants from the Police and Crime commissioner and local councillors Mr. Jarvis and Mr. Singh. We would like to thank Denise Clews and Mancetter council for donating funds for the boxing club that will support us in going mobile and help a lot more youths in the Mancetter area.
