BEAT PRIORITIES

Road Safety - Road Safety - Results from "my views" survey conducted by the local team, via Neighbourhood Link, indicate that this is a priority concern in the Rushey Mead area. This includes speeding, bad parking, use of mobile phones, drink and drug driving Key locations include Gypsy Lane /Gleneagles Avenue / Peebles Way and outside local schools.

Anti-Social Behaviour- Drug use and drug dealing in green and open spaces has been identified by both surveys completed and by your local beat team through various patrols within the area.

Street drinking— Reports of street drinking in the local area have been highlighted by residents.

We did - We're Taking Action on Road Safety - We've been working closely with our partner agencies, listening to your concerns and taking action to improve road safety across the Rushey Mead area.

- You'll see your local beat officers carrying out patrols at schools during key times to help keep pupils, parents, and other road users safe. We'll also be offering advice and taking action around child car seats and seatbelt use.

- We're working closely with the council and partner agencies to help tackle and improve parking issues in your area.

- We're also committed to identifying and dealing with those using vehicles without the correct documentation, such as a valid driving licence or insurance.

- Please contact the team if you have any concerns.

We Did -We're Taking Action on ASB - The beat team will continue to develop intelligence based on drug dealing within the Rushey Mead area.

- Local officers will conduct stop searches where grounds apply and show a high visibility presence within the area.

- We will actively engage with members of the public and encourage you to inform us of the concerns that you have.

- Our hot spot areas for drug issues includes areas of the Three Kilns Car park, Sandfield Close and Lockerbie Avenue. Officers have focused on these areas and will continue to.

We're Taking Action on Street Drinkers - Our Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers will look to focus on dealing with this rising trend and the types of anti-social behaviour which stems from it.

- Officers have liaised with the council and have completed patch walks within the located areas.



🚓 Road Safety Operation – Rushey Mead & Northfields

This month, officers, PCSOs and Police Volunteers carried out a proactive roads policing operation across the Rushey Mead and Northfields areas.

The focus was on the **Fatal 4 offences** — speeding, drink/drug driving, mobile phone use, and seat belt offences with a zero-tolerance approach to keep our roads safe.

Targeted locations included **Gypsy Lane and Peebles Way**, both residential areas with a 30mph speed limit.
