<p>Anti social behaviour including e-scooters electric bikes, environmental, targeted or nuisance behaviour from individuals or groups.</p>	<p>our police officers are addressing reports of anti-social behaviour by including initiatives such as targeted patrols around key areas. As the school summer holidays are due to start these will be increased and with more hot weather we would urge parents to educate your children in safety around water.</p>
<p>Drugs is a priority, this includes drug use in public spaces as well as reports of drug use in dwellings, drug driving and any intelligence concerning selling and distributing and education around drug use.</p>	<p>We have held beat surgeries to speak to local residents, we are gathering and developing intelligence, and, where sufficient evidence is obtained, applying for warrants. We rely on your ongoing support and information provided by yourselves to assist us in this work.</p>
<p>Road Safety issues:- Road safety including speeding, improper use of the road, and road traffic offences.</p>	<p>We have been conducting regular patrols to improve road safety across the area, including stopping vehicles where offences have been identified. Officers have taken action in relation to issues such as speeding, mobile phone use and other road traffic offences as well as engaging with drivers to offer advice and promote safer driving.</p>

News

PCSO Dan has been out and about on the beat attending some great community events. First was Enderby Library Coffee Morning which was really busy and great to see local councillors and residents coming together. Then it was off to Fosse Park bike marking event with Go Travel, it was very popular and a great way to promote safe, alternative travel. Finally he attended the New Lubbethorpe Summer Fete, fantastic turnout and lots of community spirit! He even grabbed a few photos with some aspiring future police officers.



As we had the Neighbourhood Policing Week last month, we highlighted the neighbourhood-focused work carried out under Operation Spinner, including regular ASB patrols targeting the anti-social use of vehicles in our hotspot areas. In response to increased activity and reports, we installed the rest of our new warning signs in key locations as part of this continued work.



PCSO Sarah conducted some high-visibility patrols on Queens Drive and Packhorse Drive, Enderby following reports of ASB and off-road motorbikes. She was also called to Littlethorpe for a neighbour dispute and reports of a fire which the beat team will be picking up for further enquiries. Patrols have also been conducted at Narborough Park and Memorial Park (Council Offices) after recent ASB concerns, a visible presence is a subtle reminder we're around.

We also received reports of students setting fire to their school books outside of Brockington College. We did attend but there was no evidence of this and the students had left prior to our arrival, we are hoping this was a one off incident and would urge parents to speak to their children regarding the dangers of fire.
