## What matters to you

We have revised our beat priorities as of October 2025 to reflect what we have been told concerns the community most.

- **Priority 1: Commercial Burglaries:**

**What we did:** Two businesses were targeted in January. Investigations are still underway and intelligence is being developed to identify suspects and mitigate impact on local businesses.

- **Priority 2: Victoria Park Car Park vehicle ASB.**

**What we did:** Further reports of vehicle related ASB on Granville Road car park has seen the frequency of incidents shift to early ours of the morning. Despite it being quieter at this time with less risk, our Roads Policing Team still frequent the area.

- **Priority 3: Vehicle Crime** - We will carry on with our initiatives to remind and re-educate about vehicle security over the winter months.

**What we Did:** 3 Vehicle related reports have come to us in January—patrols during the darker hours will be continuing for the foreseeable, with vehicles being checked for vulnerabilities where appropriate.

## Other Local News

- King's Trust—PCSO Paul and PC Sam were invited along to a King's Trust session at Central LFRS. The group were given the opportunity to ask questions and find out more about day-to-day policing.
- Bike Register—Bike Register events are still happening throughout the South Leicester Area, check on our Facebook page from time to time to see if one will be held locally to your area.
- Licensing and Trading Standards—Our Problem Management Plan came to its conclusion recently as an establishment that was drawing ASB to the area were seen in City Hall, a slow steady process that has lead to the proprietors taking accountability for their Licensing conditions.
