BEAT PRIORITIES

Road Safety - Results from "my views" survey conducted by the local team, via Neighbourhood Link, indicate that this is a priority concern in the Rushey Mead area. This includes speeding, bad parking, use of mobile phones, drink and drug driving. Key locations include Gipsy Lane / Gleneagles Avenue / Peebles Way and outside local schools.

Street drinking— Reports of street drinking in the local area have been highlighted by residents.

Anti-Social Behaviour- Drug use and drug dealing in green and open spaces has been identified by both surveys completed and by your local beat team through various patrols within the area.

We did - We're Taking Action on Road Safety - We've been working closely with our partner agencies, listening to your concerns and taking action to improve road safety across the Rushey Mead area.

- You'll see your local beat officers carrying out patrols at schools during key times to help keep pupils, parents, and other road users safe. We'll also be offering advice and taking action around child car seats and seatbelt use.
- We're working closely with the council and partner agencies to help tackle and improve parking issues in your area.
- We're also committed to identifying and dealing with those using vehicles without the correct documentation, such as a valid driving licence or insurance.
- Please contact the team if you have any concerns.

We're Taking Action on Street Drinkers - Our Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers will look to focus on dealing with this rising trend and the types of anti-social behaviour which stems from it.

- Officers have liaised with the council and have completed patch walks within the located areas.

We Did - We're Taking Action on ASB - The beat team will continue to develop intelligence based on drug dealing within the Rushey Mead area.

- Local officers will conduct stop searches where grounds apply and show a high visibility presence within the area.
- We will actively engage with members of the public and encourage you to inform us of the concerns that you have.
- Our hot spot areas for drug issues includes areas of the Three Kilns Car park, Sandfield Close and Lockerbie Avenue. Officers have focused on these areas and will continue to.

Community Patch Walk Update



A big thank you to our local councillors, the Environment Agency, City Warden team, and residents who joined us for the community patch walk on the 29th July 2026 around Badminton Road, Jesse Jackson Park, Nicklaus Road and Trevino Drive.

The walk provided an opportunity to discuss local concerns including anti-social behaviour, littering, park-related issues, traffic management and transport concerns. These discussions will help shape plans ahead of local festivities later this year and ensure community concerns are identified and addressed.

By working together with residents and partner agencies, we aim to reduce crime and ASB, strengthen community relationships, and improve the quality of life for everyone in the area.

Following recent jewellery thefts in the Belgrave Road area, please stay vigilant and take simple steps to protect yourself and your valuables.

- Keep valuable jewellery out of sight where possible.
- Stay aware of your surroundings, especially in busy areas.
- Be cautious if approached by strangers who try to distract you.
- Report any suspicious behaviour to police immediately.
- Keep a record and photographs of valuable jewellery.
