## #YouSaid - What matters to you

Through Neighbourhood Link, social media and local engagement events, we have listened and will be prioritising:

- **Drug dealing and associated ASB on Kane Close.**

You have raised concerns regarding drug use and the anti-social behaviour associated with this type of criminality.

We have received a number of reports relating to issues surrounding drug use in this area. We have completed a warrant and will continue to work with partners to seek long term solutions.

- **ASB in Coalville Town Centre Following Local Football Matches**

We are aware of continued issues with young people causing general ASB after local football matches at Coalville Town FC.

We are working with local residents, management at the club and partners in problem solving teams to develop long term solutions.

- **Speeding/Nuisance vehicles Ashby Road/London Road.**

We are aware of issues surrounding ongoing issues with inconsiderate and antisocial road use.

We will complete targeted operations in the areas concerned and look to offer education and enforcement where required.

### Partnership Working For A Safer Coalville

Coalville Town Beat Team hold regular patch walks, these are organised with our local partners for example North West Leicestershire District Council, Housing Associations and Crime Reduction Teams. Patch walks are a great way to speak to local residents with a joint partnership approach to tackle issues that matter to you. So far this year we have conducted patch walks on Grieves Close, Marlborough Square and Bridge Road, Coalville this is following reports of Anti Social Behaviour. We will use this information to tackle the issues that matter to you.

## A busy week for the Safer Streets and Neighbourhood Priority Team

During a week snap shot, the team have arrested eleven people for an array of offences including Burglary, Theft, Recall to Prison and Domestic Violence. They have finished the week by doing night shifts over the weekend policing the Night Time Economy (NTE). We're pleased to say it mostly passed without incident across Ashby and Coalville. Finally ending the night shift with two more arrests, one for being wanted on a recall to prison and a second for failing to stop for Police and drugs offences, both remain in police custody.
