**Collision Appeal**

Police are appealing for witnesses and information after a serious collision in Eastbourne.

The incident involved the driver of a black Hyundai Tucson, and the rider of a black Aprillia RS125 motorcycle.



It happened at about 6.10pm on February 19 in Brodrick Road in the town.

The motorcycle rider, a 23-year-old local man, sustained serious but not life-threatening injuries.

The driver of the Hyundai, a 62-year-old local man, was not injured.

Officers are investigating, and want witnesses or anyone with relevant information to come forward.

This includes anyone with CCTV, doorbell or dashcam footage of the incident or of the vehicles in the area at the time.

## Arrests made following drug exchange



A 32-year-old man, from Eastbourne, has been arrested after police witnessed a drug exchange.

On the evening of Friday 21 February, while patrolling the Meads area of Eastbourne, officers observed two women, and a man involved in what appeared to be a drug exchange.

As officers approached, the man attempted to flee but was detained for a drug search. He was subsequently arrested on suspicion of being concerned in the supply of drugs after officers found sums of cash on him.

The man has since been released on police bail, while investigations continue.

## Everyone has the right to feel safe on a night out.

Your Eastbourne Night Safety Marshals (NSM), continue to work alongside Police and local partners to help keep people safe.



Working each Friday and Saturday night between 8pm and 4am, the NSM are made up of teams of individuals who have been trained in identifying and helping vulnerable people, and are there to help provide an extra level of support on top of the extensive work already being done by Sussex Police and partner agencies to keep people safe during the night-time economy.

The marshals also complement the work of the Eastbourne Street Pastors, and schemes such as Best Bar None, bringing businesses together to work together to promote the town in a positive light.

If you or someone you know are a victim of crime or need assistance on a night out, speak to a police officer, bar staff, Street Pastor or Night Safety Marshal.
