Your priorities are chosen quarterly and are based upon information gathered through NHL (Neighbourhood Link), social media, local engagement, and emerging crime trends. You have stated that the following key themes are important to you.

Drug offences including drug use and supplying has been identified as a neighbourhood priority.	We have held beat surgeries to speak to local residents, we are gathering and developing intelligence, and, where sufficient evidence is obtained, applying for warrants. We rely on your ongoing support and information provided by yourselves to assist us in this work.
Business & Residential Burglaries	Officers are continuing to investigate a burglary which occurred in Potters Marston during June. Forensics and house to house has been conducted and the victim is being supported. 3 males entered the property possibly believing no one to be home however the occupant was in the property and chased the males off.
Road safety can be categorized as speeding, road awareness and other manner of driving. Either in general or within the community. Road safety can also include improper use of the road and road traffic offences, which ties in with our other priority ASB.	We have been conducting regular patrols to improve road safety across the area, including stopping vehicles where offences have been identified. Officers have taken action in relation to issues such as speeding, mobile phone use and other road traffic offences as well as engaging with drivers to offer advice and promote safer driving.

News

It's come to our attention that thieves are attending bike events, such as bike nights, and placing tracking devices on unattended motorbikes. These devices allow offenders to locate where bikes are kept and later steal them. With regular bike meets at Stoney Cove and Triumph on the Hinckley and Blaby area, riders are encouraged to stay vigilant. Please stay aware of who is around your bike, check it regularly and ask a trusted friend to keep an eye out if leaving it unattended. Regularly check your bike for anything unusual or out of place. There is software you can get which alerts you when you are near a tracker. If you attend a bike night, try to park where you can clearly see your bike at all times.

Unfortunately we are seeing an increase in reports of Rogue Traders, within the Stoney Stanton and Sapcote villages. You will often see such individuals offering gardening, roofing, driveway or general labour work at "too good to be true" prices and leaving residents out of pocket with poor quality or unfinished jobs. Please stay vigilant and keep an eye on any of your elderly neighbours.



Stoney Stanton had its annual carnival and whilst it can't be statistically proven, it did appear that this year may have seen the highest numbers of attendees there and at the fair on Carey Hill Park Memorial Field.
