What matters to you

We have revised our beat priorities as of April 2025 to reflect what we have been told concerns the community most.

- **Priority 1: Vehicle related ASB—Howard Road** We have identified hotspots with the help of reports and consultations with residents and Leicester City Council.
 - **What we did:** We have been visiting the area of Howard Road to speak with residents and taking live reports regarding vehicles causing unnecessary noise and groups gathering. We will be continuing work with Leicester City Council, residents and speaking with groups in the area.
- **Priority 2: e-Scooters and e-Bikes** Ongoing concerns of e-scooters and e-bikes being ridden dangerously in the Clarendon Park Area.
 - **What we did:** A number of e-bikes and e-scooters have been seized during the course of speed/scooter ops on Queens Road and Victoria Park. This will be continuing for the foreseeable.
- **Priority 3: Victoria Park Seasonal issues:** We are anticipating Victoria Park becoming much busier as the weather warms up.
 - **What we Did:** We will continue to work closely with Leicester City Council over the coming months while the park gets busier to ensure it is a safe environment during day-to-day visits and whilst events are being hosted on the park.

Other Local News

- Victoria Park Car Park Officers have issued section 59 notices to drivers misusing Victoria Park car park. Section 59 warnings may be issued for those knowingly using vehicles in an anti social manner causing Harassment, Alarm and Distress.
- Ramadan Officers have been visiting local religious centres and education centres during the Month of Ramadan. The Eid Celebrations on Victoria Park also passed by with minimal issues reported.
- Staff Change: We would like to welcome PCSO 6652 Paul Williams who has just joined the Clarendon beat. Paul is an experienced officer and will be a great addition to the team! Paul replaces PCSO Hector Hand who has left Leicestershire police to start a new career with British Transport Police. Hector was a member of the team for 3 years and we wish him all the best for the future.
