What matters to you

From data collated from local surveys, beat knowledge, intelligence and reports made to Leicestershire Police, the following have been highlighted as priorities within the community.

Priority 1: Drugs.

You said: Drug use and supply is ongoing in the Saffron Lane Estate and in other areas of the community.

We did: A cannabis grow was recently located at an address on Knighton Fields Road West. Officers were called to the location initially after a report was made of a possible disturbance at an address. Entry was gained and the property was found to be used for growing and cultivating cannabis with four arrests made at the scene. The address has now been cleared and made safe with further enquires ongoing.

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) in open spaces.

You said: ASB in open spaces is still occurring in parks, play areas and other areas.

We did: There has been an increase in reports of ASB in the Neston Gardens area, patrols in this location have increased and work is ongoing with partner agencies with CCTV enquires underway to identify and deal with those involved.

Priority 3: Vehicle Misuse/Safety.

You said: There has been an increase in the use of E-Scooters and vehicle being found unsafe.

We did: We continue to educate, engage and enforce those driving vehicles without the correct and necessary paperwork to be safe and secure on the roads, recently a vehicle was seized from a driver who was found to be behind the wheel without insurance and a road traffic offence issued.

Other Local News

Last week saw the return of Sceptre which is a national campaign supported by police forces all over the country aimed at addressing, tackling and preventing knife crime. Leicestershire Police have supported the campaign by conducting visits to retailers to remind them of the challenge 25 policy and to report any incidents were young people try to obtain bladed articles. High visibility patrols, visits to schools and other events have taken place all with the aim of talking, educating and informing people of the dangers of carrying a weapon.

The local team have been doing the same with visits to local retailers and informing the community during this campaign of how, where and what to report, our dedicated Facebook pages from across all areas have supported the campaign by publishing useful information and action taken during this important week.

If you suspect anyone to be involved in knife crime, either carrying a weapon or have been involved with people who are then please report this, you can report to police or to crime stopper's anomalously.
