What Matters to You

With data provided by our local community we have decided on our 3 beat priorities.

- **Priority 1 -** You've told us through surveys and local engagement that there are issues around the **anti-social behaviour in the area of Braunstone park** and the surrounding road network
- Priority 2 You've told us through surveys and local engagements that there are issues around drug use and supply at various locations across the beat, and the associated Anti-Social Behaviour.
- **Priority 3– Theft from Motor vehicles** from viewing crime data, there is currently an identified problem with theft from vehicles in the vicinity of Narborough Road and surrounding side streets.

Anti-social behaviour around Braunstone Park What We have done #YouSaidWeDid

Winstanley House staff and visitors have again received abuse from youths. Patrols have been increased to identify and deter those causing the issues.

All ASB calls are investigated and once offenders are identified we will work with our partner agencies and adopt the incremental approach to dealing with those who cause harm. Sanctions range from advice/warnings for first time offenders to court hearings.

We have an anti-social behaviour report open in relation to youths throwing eggs and flour at passing vehicles in the area of Cort Crescent. Work is continuing to identify the youths involved, and appropriate action will be taken using the Incremental Approach.

Leaflets have been delivered by PCSOs to local shops on Alymer Road, Raven Road, Wellinger Way.

Drug Use and Dealing associated at known Hotspot addresses in the Neighbourhood What We have done #YouSaidWeDid







Good news—intelligence development by PCSOs and members of the local community has led to a warrant being obtained by PC 1576 Martin. This related to a suspected cannabis grow on Lavender Road. The warrant was successfully executed by your local beat team along with the help from the Neighbourhood Priority Team and one male located inside the property has been arrested.

The Neighbourhood Priority Team have also enforced on an address on Imperial Avenue. Although nothing of note was located, it has provided vital intelligence.

If you have any concerns or intelligence that people are using addresses to deal drugs from and want the Neighbourhood Team to enforce against those tenants and persons responsible please report it to us. This can be done by calling us, reporting online at Leics Police, and also by contacting Crimestoppers which will keep you anonymous!!





Theft from Motor Vehicles What We have done #YouSaidWeDid

ASB in our Community

During recent months we have continued to see reports of ASB across the Ward. Police are working closely with Leicester City Council Community Safety Team regards ongoing neighbour disputes on Audley End and Ashthorpe Road.

Braunstone Park has seen an increase in youths throwing items at passing vehicles and Winstanley House staff and visitors have again received abuse from youths. Patrols have been increased to identify and deter those causing the issues.

All ASB calls are investigated and once offenders are identified we will work with our partner agencies and adopt the incremental approach to dealing with those who cause harm. Sanctions range from advice/warnings for first time offenders to court hearings.
