We have listened to you and the concerns you raised and will prioritise the following,

What matters to you

Priority 1 - What you have said:

You have told us that anti-social behaviour (ASB) is a concern in your community, particularly involving the use of quad bikes and groups of rowdy youths gathering in parks and recreational areas.

Action taken

In response, we are increasing patrols in identified hotspots to deter this behaviour and provide reassurance to the public. We are also actively gathering intelligence to identify those responsible and take appropriate action .

Priority 2 -

What you have said:

The community has also stated that speeding and parking issues are a concern at various locations throughout the Charnwood East area.

Action taken

Road safety remains a key concern raised by members of our community, particularly in relation to speeding and parking near schools. In response, we recently conducted a speed enforcement operation on Glebe road in Syston, targeting areas identified through community feedback and local intelligence. Static patrols have also been deployed at a location raised near the traffic lights to monitor driver behaviour and provide a visible deterrent. Further speed operations are planned, and work will continue to address the issues highlighted as a concern.

Priority 3 -

What you have said:

Retail theft has been identified as a growing concern within the beat, with several stores being repeatedly targeted.

Action taken

In response, officers have supported investigations by taking statements and collecting CCTV evidence. We have also liaised with local businesses to strengthen working relationships and improve outcomes when offences occur. Regular patrols have been carried out at key locations, including Thurmaston Retail Park, Tesco in Syston, and Branstons Services, to provide reassurance and deter further incidents.

The Beat Team News

Everyday your local beat team are conducting marked Police car patrols through the villages of Charnwood East. These villages are Syston, Thurmaston, Thrussington, East Goscote, Ratcliffe on the Wreake, Barkby, Barbky Thorpe, Beeby, Rearsby, Hamilton Lea, Queniborough, South Croxton and Thorpebury in the Limes.

Thank you to those who came to our beat engagements this month. Thank you to those for raising their concerns and for all the positive feedback.

On 19/08, PCSO 6024 conducted speed checks along Glebe way in Syston. We want to remind everyone about the serious dangers of speeding. Every time you choose to exceed the speed limit, you put yourself,

your passengers, and everyone else on the road at risk.



Crime prevention advcie:

Please remain vigilant and report any suspicious activity without delay and if you feel a crime is in progress then call 999 and take this time to review your own security.

Look at having a security light fitted, alongside good quality CCTV and ensure that windows and doors are left locked and secure and do not leave valuables on display - this can include empty boxes of that new PSS. joad or similar.

Alongside this check how accessible your rear garden is - fix that lock on the gate, replace that fence panel - also a brilliant deterrent is some defensive planting ${\tt I\!R}$ around the perimeter of rear gardens.

Keep your property secure with these useful crime prevention tips

A 'Fatal 4' operation was conducted at Roundhill School, Thurmaston, with 14 vehicles stopped. The drivers were reported for either mobile phone use whilst driving or not wearing a seatbelt. The term "Fatal 4" refers to four dangerous driving behaviours that frequently contribute to road accidents injuries, and fatalities. Speeding, driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, Not wearing a seatbelt, using a mobile phone while driving.




