What we've been doing this month

After the launch of our new contact system Met.Engage; we have seen steady progress in local who have sign ups and look forward to more locals helping to improve SNTs impact in the area. It is particularly relevant to those who live and work in separate locations – you might be a teacher, social worker or council employee whose place of employment is Peckham but you reside elsewhere. Maybe even a local councillor who represents one part of the borough but lives in another. It's not possible to register for two different areas under the same email but you can register from a personal address and a work email. Whilst this means having two Met.Engage accounts (which you will have to access separately) you will be able to keep up to date with events both where you live and the area you work.

On August 12th Peckham SNT were the vanguard on a large multi-agency operation across Peckham ward; which included a number of arrests, community protection warnings, ASB warnings and (after a particularly difficult and involved arrest) a number of positive public engagements with our partners and support services. Thank you to all who participated from our side, I know our Team felt energised by having such support from other SNTs, TCT, TSG and Partner Agencies.

Once again PC Strickland has had an active month with two arrests. One for Drug Offences the other Criminal Damage Stalking and Malicious Communication. All of this was done whilst assisting with Live Facial Recognition across BCU and night shifts at Notting Hill Carnival. Keep up the good work Ben.

Finally, with the new (albeit minimal) influx of PCSOs to all of AS in the coming weeks; PCSO Broughton-Rates will be in a team of trainers for these new recruits. This will be done in tandem with PCSO Baxter (Nunhead & Queens Road SNT) and a growing team of other PCSO colleagues. We look forward to the continued efforts of our Community Support Officers and partners both locally and Central South wide. If you see us around, please do stop and chat.
