

What matters to you

We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised through surveys, community consultations and analysing crime trends.

Using this data, we have created the following Oakham & Barleythorpe priorities that the Dedicated Neighbourhood Team will focus their efforts on:

Priority 1: Anti-social behaviour (ASB): You said: Anti-social behaviour in and around Oakham & Barleythorpe is becoming more frequent in certain areas.

What we have done: PC Hughes and PCSO Lauren have been responding to a number of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) incidents within the community. We have supported victims of ASB, attended ongoing issues, and worked closely with partner agencies through multi-agency meetings to tackle these incidents effectively.

Priority 2: Road Safety: You said: Speeding vehicles on Oakham & Barleythorpe roads is a priority you want us to address, specifically the lack of adherence to 30mph zones.

What We Have Done: PC Hughes and PCSO Lauren along with the other neighbourhood officers and response officers have been out proactively stopping cars, we have issued as a team section 59s which refers to driving a vehicle in an anti-social manner and tickets have been issued for other motoring offences.

Priority 3: Drug dealing/taking: You said: Reports of drug dealing/ taking in and around Oakham & Barleythorpe.

What We Have Done: PC Hughes and PCSO Lauren have been out patrolling at different times throughout the town making full use of stop search powers and dealing with offenders.
