Here is your monthly update on the work carried out across the wards of Beltinge and Reculver over the past few weeks. Thank you to all residents who continue to report concerns and support our policing efforts. Your information helps us target issues effectively and keep our community safe.



Targeted Activity: Anti-Social Behaviour on the Hillborough Estate

Over the last month, we received multiple reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) occurring in the Hillborough Estate area. Incidents reported included:

- A resident having their property egged on several occasions
- A front door being kicked by unknown individuals
- Stones thrown at a resident's window

In response:

- I visited affected residents, offering reassurance and reviewing available CCTV footage.
- High-visibility patrols were carried out during the key times in which ASB was occurring (17:00–21:00).
- Three youths matching descriptions from earlier reports were stopped and spoken to. Their details were taken, Body Worn Video images recorded, for follow up action.
- I liaised with the Child Centred Policing Team (CCPT) to help identify the individuals involved.
- I also engaged with two local shops to raise awareness about youths purchasing eggs and the link to local ASB.



Work on this issue will continue, and residents are encouraged to report any further incidents so we can maintain early intervention

Drug-Related Concerns – Ongoing Work

We have been responding to community concerns about cannabis use and suspected drug dealing linked to a male in the area.

Over the past month:

- I have maintained regular contact with a nearby resident who has frequently reported cannabis use coming from the male's address.
- A Community Protection Warning (CPW) was issued to the male regarding cannabis use.
- A Community Protection Notice (CPN) is scheduled to be issued shortly to address ongoing behaviour.

We will continue monitoring this location and working with residents to ensure prompt action is taken.

ASB and Disturbances at a Residential Flat

We have also been dealing with persistent disturbances linked to a male residing at a local flat. Reports over recent months have included:

- Frequent visitors involved in drug use and aggressive behaviour
- Loud arguments, incoherent shouting, crying, and noise disturbances continuing into the early hours
- Sounds of banging and items being damaged within the property
- Strong smells of cannabis affecting nearby residents and communal areas

Actions taken so far include:

- Issuing a Community Protection Warning (CPW) to address ongoing anti-social behaviour
- Working towards obtaining a Closure Order for the address due to the ongoing impact on neighbouring residents
- **Supporting our community:** By working closely with residents, local partners, and community groups, we aim to build trust, improve safety, and create stronger relationships across the area. Whether it's providing reassurance, acting on concerns, or helping vulnerable individuals access the support they need, our focus is on being
