West Leicester - Neighbourhood Policing

Three Main Priorities

The three main priorities your neighbourhood team are currently focusing on:

You said: Drug Use/Dealing around Glenfield Road East

We did: A long ongoing issue for the area which has faced a targeted response by our Team. Regular patrols are ongoing and our intelligence picture is under constant reviews.

You said: Anti Social Behaviour—Littering, dog fouling, parking issues, criminal damage, mis-use of pavements and more

We did: Our team have been busy investigating cases of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) ranging from youths causing damage to rental vans, parking issues on Tudor Road and Tudor Close and issues regarding untoward behaviour from neighbours.

You said: Thefts from/of Vehicles, Burglaries and Robberies.

We did: Your Fosse Ward Officers have been working hard to ensure all line of enquiries are conducted around reports of Thefts, Burglaries and Robberies. We assist our detective teams by conducting CCTV checks using our expert local knowledge, visiting victims and witnesses to ensure we gain any further information possible to aid the investigations and also by conducting safeguarding on those who need it.



What has the Beat Team been up to?

The neighbourhood team has been very busy all across the Fosse Ward beat area, throughout the month of September with both investigations of crime and community engagements.

Cannabis Grows on the Fosse Ward

Since our work during 2023 we have seen a large decrease in both reports regarding possible Cannabis Grows from members of the Public, as well as suspicious linked behaviour from our own Team while on patrol. This is not to say that there are none out there!

Recently our team have been investigating new leads on addresses that have exhibited signs of suspicious behaviour, helping to increase our intelligence picture going forward so we can look at possible warrants to conduct!



Seen something suspicious? Different people coming and going in the night from an address? Multiple deliveries in the middle of the night? Heard loud humming noises coming from next door? Please report anything you think is of interest to us through 101, or you can comment on our posts on Neighbourhood Link and we will contact you to follow up! You could be our first lead to getting a warrant!

Drug Dealing/Usage around Flora Street/Noble Street

We have recently seen an increase in suspicious figures around the area of Flora Street, Noble Street and Frederick Jackson House. While conducting our routine patrols I always talk about, we encountered an unusual presence of known street lifestyle persons who didn't wish to stay and chat, but this was no problem as we already recognised them from previous issues!



Our Police Constable's and the Sergeant have spent some time conducting 'sneaky' work in the area during the day and night and conducted several stop searches on their first targeted shift. Small amounts of drugs were located on multiple individuals including an arrest made on one of these individuals as he was wanted for outstanding matters! Spooky Halloween Patrols and Diwali Celebrations

The end of October has seen a great deal of activity during late afternoons and evenings of people out trick or treating and/or celebrating Diwali!

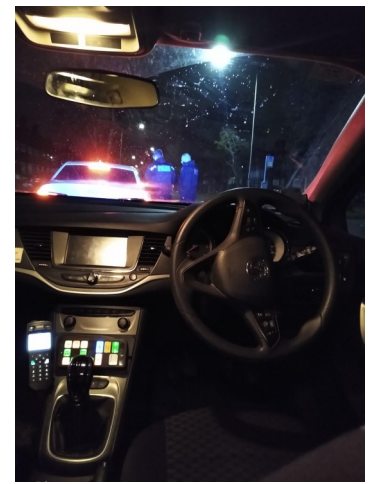
