- Anti Social Behaviour —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.


- Anti Social Behaviour—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas.

#### **Court Result:**

Julian LACEY (55 years old) from Broughton Astley — attended Loughborough Crown Court on 24th November in relation to the following offences:

- 1. Harassment put in fear of violence
- 2. Possess offensive weapon in public place
- 3. Section 4 Public Order
- 4. Criminal Damage value under £5000
- 5. Criminal Damage value under £5000



This was a long investigation with a lot of work put in by not just the local beat team, but also response colleagues, local housing agencies and district council. This enabled not just a conviction in criminal court but also civil court matters to safeguard local residents and prevent future issues occurring.

#### **Great Result:**

A suspect linked to a non-residential burglary in Broughton Astley has been arrested, charged and remanded for this report.

After great investigative work by both the Harborough response officers and the Leicestershire Police Forensic team, the male has been identified and arrested for this report.



He has also been dealt with for a criminal damage report in Lutterworth.

## Good Deed of the Day:

Whilst completing patrols around the Kimcote and Walton area on 18th November, PC Glover located a broken down vehicle on the Gilmorton Road just outside of Kimcote. The driver had suffered a blown out tyre and to top it off her phone had also run out of battery.

Thankfully being at the right place at the right time meant the vehicle could be safely recovered on the dark countryside road and the driver taken home by recovery.



#### **ASB Patrols:**

The local beat team have completed ASB patrols and checks of the local parks and industrial estates around Broughton Astley to make sure things are running smoothly during these darker nights.

## **Darker Nights Campaign:**

- Residential burglaries can be deeply upsetting. It can be traumatic to lose valuable and sentimental items from your home and the thought of a stranger invading your property is distressing.
- Protect your home against opportunist burglars by remembering to lock up and light up.
- These darker evenings can provide the perfect cover for burglars who can easily spot an insecure window or door, or valuable left in plain sight.
- Check out our other advice on how to keep your property safe: Keep burglars out of your property | Leicestershire Police (leics.police.uk)
- Install strong fences and gates and make sure that they are always locked. Consider adding trellis and spiky plants to the fences to make it difficult for burglars to climb over them.
- Consider installing external CCTV cameras or video doorbells. Always lock your windows and doors when you are in and out.
- Try to make your house look as occupied as possible when you are not there. Use automatic timer switches to turn lamps on and off sporadically.
- Do not leave your house and vehicle keys in the lock or on a side table in view of a window or next to a door. If you wish to obtain a faraday pouch you can visit a police station and ask for a car key pouch.
- Check your UPVC or Euro Cylinder door locks to see if they're snap resistant. It should be stamped with a three-star kite mark. For more information on this please visit the Leicestershire Police Website.
- To not leave items in open porches that could be used to enter your home such as curved-handled umbrellas. These items could be used as "fishing" implements to use through a letter box or open window.
- If you're going away, cancel newspapers and milk. You could also ask a trusted neighbour or friend to keep an eye on your property and take your post inside.
- Use external sensor lights on your driveway / rear garden.
- A Think about increasing the visibility of the entrances and exits of your home. Consider cutting back and removing large plants and bushes that restrict visibility from the road.
