

With September coming to an end, we are now officially entering Autumn. CSU are already putting plans together to keep you safe throughout Autumn and Winter.

With that in mind, throughout September, we have:

Targeted activity: Patrol teams have committed to listening to public concerns and conducting proactive patrols—both on foot and via mobile units—across Whitstable's newest estate, Whitstable Heights. This initiative was launched to help deter and reduce crime in the area through visible presence and targeted enforcement. As a result of these patrols, officers recently identified and seized an uninsured vehicle being driven within the estate. The driver received a substantial fine, reinforcing our commitment to tackling unlawful activity and discouraging reoffending.



 Hotspot Patrolling: Beyond Whitstable Heights, patrols have been actively engaging with the community, managing Problem Solving Plans (PSPs) and individuals linked to them. We've also been focusing on shoplifting incidents in the town centre, supported by high-visibility foot patrols across all Whitstable wards

One particularly active day saw officers covering over **33,000 steps**, ensuring coverage across all areas of Whitstable. Additionally, officers visited a local **infant school**, where children were learning about **Keyworkers**—a great opportunity to build positive relationships and educate young residents about the role of police in their community.

Good work story:

Kent Police received reports of persons attempting to steal a motorbike on the 7th of September 2025 in the early hours of the morning near Canterbury East Railway Station. Officers attended immediately after the call came in and located a male wearing a balaclava in the vicinity. A search revealed that the male was in possession of a balaclava, a screwdriver and bolt cutters. He was subsequently arrested and a case is being built to be submitted to the Crown Prosecution Service.
