What matters to you

We have identified the following priorities which are in place as of 1st April 2026:

- **Priority 1: Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)**

You Said: ASB is prevalent in the local area and continues to cause concerns, particularly within the estate.

We Did: Patrols have continued in hotspot areas, particularly around local green areas. Officers have been conducting joint work with partners at Leicester City Council, including housing and ASB services. We continue to encourage residents to report incidents to help build patterns for patrol and enforcement.

- **Priority 2: Drug Dealing**

You Said: Drug dealing continues to be a key issue around the estate.

We Did: We are continuing to progress partnership work with Leicester City Council in relation to tenancy enforcement and potential closure orders where evidence thresholds are met. Local Officers continue to utilise stop and search powers where appropriate. Intelligence development remains ongoing and we encourage residents to continue providing information confidentially via 101 or Crimestoppers

- **Priority 3: Off-Road Vehicles**

You Said: In previous years as we head towards the summer, off-road bikes and quad bikes start to become an issue – being ridden illegally and dangerously in open and green spaces.

We Did: Operation YATTER is now in place to tackle the issue of off-road bikes on the open spaces around the beat area. Earlier this month, Officers have seized one stolen motorbike and two E-bikes that were believed to be involved in causing issues around the estate. We will continue to utilise various methods that have proved successful in previous summers.

Other Local News

- ◆ Have you spotted an environmental issue whilst out and about and want to report it? Take a photo and report it using the 'Love Clean Streets' app. It's free and easy to use - your problem can be logged in seconds. This service is also used by your local policing team, as we have found it to be a really useful tool. Examples of what you can report include; abandoned vehicles, illegal parking, overgrown grass and much more. Once reported, this goes to the correct team at Leicester City Council. STREET SAFE

giving people the power to report areas where they feel unsafe

- ◆ Street Safe is a national initiative launched by Police which allows a person to provide feedback to the police (and partners) on areas where they feel unsafe within their community. It allows you to comment on where you feel unsafe and the reasons why you might feel unsafe e.g. due to poor lighting, drug use/dealing, graffiti or issues such as littering.
