#YouSaidWeDid - What matters to you

Priority 1: Anti-social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park, Cort Crescent and Gallards Hill

You said: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park continues as a priority concern from the community. Over the winter period, the team will continue to concentrate on this location.

We Did: Anti-Social Behaviour in and around Braunstone Park remains a key priority for the team. Throughout January, officers have continued to carry out regular high-visibility patrols across the park and surrounding areas. The location is also being proactively targeted by the nightly ASB car, which has provided an increased police presence during peak times.

As a result of this continued focus, we have seen a notable reduction in ASB related calls, both within the park itself and at Winstanley House. The team will maintain this level of visibility and engagement as the winter period continues.

Priority 2: Road Safety

You Said: From Community Surveys and Feedback on Neighbourhood Link, road safety has been highlighted to be a local concern. We will continue to concentrate on speeding concerns and anti social behaviour caused by e bikes, e scooters and off road motorbikes.

We Did: Road safety continues to be a key local concern highlighted. The team has maintained a strong focus on tackling speeding issues and anti-social behaviour involving e-bikes, e-scooters and off-road motorbikes.

Throughout January, officers have carried out multiple Op Pedalfast operations across Braunstone and Rowley Fields. Since the operation began, this work has led to the seizure of 51 e-scooters and 40 e-bikes, alongside the recovery of a stolen motorbike and stolen bicycle. Several arrests have also been made for a range of additional offences identified during these deployments.

The team also requested support from the Road Safety Unit, resulting in the camera enforcement van being deployed to Gooding Avenue, where a further speeding operation was carried out.

Priority 3: Anti-social Behaviour (Drug related)

You Said: From the Surveys on Neighbourhood Link you have told us that drug dealing and usage at locations across the Braunstone and Rowley Fields area is a concern.

We Did: In response, the team has continued to take proactive enforcement action throughout January.

So far this year, officers have executed 11 Misuse of Drugs Act warrants, all driven by intelligence provided directly by the community. This has been supported by multiple arrests for drug-related offences across the beat. During January, a further Misuse of Drugs Act warrant was carried out on Gaddesby Avenue, resulting in another arrest. Later in the month, officers also made an additional arrest and charge for possession of a controlled drug, again on Gaddesby Avenue.

We remain committed to acting on the information you share with us and will continue working to disrupt drug-related activity across the area.

Good news

Here is a few of January's activities;

- PCSOs Beth and Julie spotted a stolen moped hanging around The Grove Community Hub. This vehicle was successfully recovered, and has been sent to our Forensic Investigators for examination.
- A prolific shoplifter was identified and sent to court after repeatedly targeting stores in and around the Narborough Road area. After team work from PCSOs and PCs on the beat team, along with officers on the Safer Streets Team, the courts issued him with a criminal behaviour order (CBO) and a suspended sentence.
- PCs George and Paige attended an address on Narborough Road and discovered a large cannabis grow, with a suspect still present inside. PC George went above and beyond, working a 15 hour shift to ensure the investigation saw a positive and safe outcome.
- During an Operation Pedalfast, PCs Paige and Ryan seized a modified e-bike capable of reaching 74 MPH, far beyond what is legal and safe for public roads and footpaths.
- PCSOs Beth and Julie, along with PCs Chelsea and Ryan attended a report of a fire at the abandoned Premier Inn on Braunstone Lane East. This incident was managed through effective multi-agency collaboration, working closely with colleagues from LFRS and EMAS.
- PCs George, Chelsea, Paige and Ryan, along with PS Craig conducted a drugs warrant on Gaddesby Avenue, along with a safeguarding visit to a separate address. Vital intelligence was gathered as a result of both of these, and patrols continue to be conducted by the beat team.
