Whilst at the Billingshurst Show we spoke with Dominic Roberts (Chair of the Billingshurst Lions Club), who we have already been working alongside on our Chapel Corner Gardens project. Dominic spoke about how a brick club could benefit children who are home-schooled or home educated by helping them and their parents to meet new people and forge new friendships.

After the event we went away and carried out some research and put a project proposal together. We took our idea to the Billingshurst Community Partnership and Dominic took it to the Billingshurst & District Lions Club and we are very excited to announce that both organisations have kindly agreed to financial donations that have enabled some Lego to be purchased and a subscription to a 'Brick Borrow' Scheme to hire some of the latest sets available. The Community Partnership has agreed to be the lead organisation for the project and Dominic will assist with running

the sessions with our support. Our thanks also go to Billingshurst Parish Council for allowing us to use The Depot to be able to run the club. We are starting with a soft launch on Thursday 10th September.

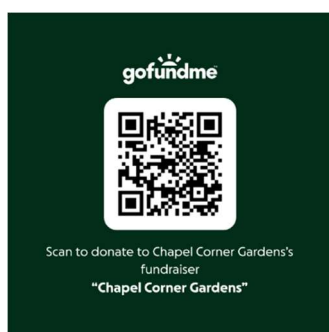
Chapel Corner Gardens – Trinity United Reformed Church

Meeting with new Age UK Community Agent – Thursday 20th August

Our role involves a large amount of partnership working with other organisations and signposting residents to services they offer. In West Sussex Age UK have a Community Agent Service. Community Agents work out in the community supporting older people to connect with activities and services to improve their wellbeing.

Age UK Community Agents can:

- * Offer short-term one-to-one support to people in the community.
- * Signpost and refer customers to other services and organisations when needed.
- * Provide support to customers to help build and maintain social connections within their communities.
- * Provide information on local clubs, groups and activities.

A new agent, Elena, has recently joined the team based at Lavinia House in Horsham and will be covering the Horsham District. Elena came to meet with us to find out about our role and to discuss what is available for older people in Billingshurst.

Standard Operating Procedure Meeting – Tuesday 25th August

We met with our colleague Alison, who is a Neighbourhood Warden in Steyning, Upper Beeding & Bramber Parishes and a member of our wider warden team to continue with an ongoing project to update and streamline our Warden's Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). A SOP is a set of step-by-step instructions that a business or organization creates to help workers carry out routine tasks safely, efficiently, and consistently. The warden role has evolved over time, and some policies and procedures have changed and with Local Government Reorganisation on the horizon, our team felt now was the time for the document to be reviewed and also to assist any new wardens joining our wider HDC team.

Meeting with HDC Community Safety Officer – Wednesday 26th August

As part of our community safety role, we are often made aware of and come across incidents of anti-social behaviour and criminal damage. Sometimes there are hotspot areas where groups congregate and where damage is caused. This month's hotspot areas feature later in the report. We work alongside other departments within Horsham District Council and Billingshurst Parish Council to try to help resolve these issues and we liaise with partner agencies such as Sussex Police, West Sussex Fire & Rescue and West Sussex County Council. On 26th August we met with one of the Community Safety Officers on our team to discuss several locations within the village where anti-social behaviour has been occurring and also the names of young people who have been coming to attention.

Family Activity Afternoons

Following the success of last year's programme, a series of free activity afternoons were once again delivered each Friday throughout the summer holidays on the Lower Station Road Playing Field. The sessions were open to all residents and aimed to provide accessible, enjoyable activities for local families during the long school summer break. A wide range of activities was available each week, including football, cricket, archery, badminton, basketball, LEGO play, colouring activities, bubble wands and many other games and challenges. This variety ensured there was something to appeal to children and young people of all ages and interests.

The sessions were very well attended, with participation regularly exceeding 20 young people on some afternoons. Attendance remained consistently positive throughout the programme, demonstrating a clear appetite for free, local activities within the community.



Feedback from parents and carers was overwhelmingly positive. Many expressed their appreciation for having safe, inclusive activities available during the school holidays, particularly at no cost. Families commented that the sessions provided valuable opportunities for children to stay active, socialise with their peers and try new activities in a welcoming environment.

The programme continues to deliver a number of important community benefits, including reducing barriers to participation by offering free activities, encouraging healthy and active lifestyles, supporting family wellbeing during the holidays, and helping to strengthen community connections. The positive attendance figures and feedback received highlight the value of continuing to provide these accessible opportunities for local families.

Overall, the summer activity afternoons were once again a great success and were warmly received by residents, providing a positive and engaging focus for children and families throughout the holiday period.

Whilst Out on Patrol

Broken Glass in Forge Way



Horsham District Council was contacted by a resident who was concerned about broken glass on a grass verge in Forge Way, as they were concerned that due to the dry conditions it may cause a fire. We attended and cleared away the glass as best as we could. We were also concerned that the glass would injure pets and wildlife in the area.

Graffiti



On checking the local village Facebook page, we noticed a post regarding concern about offensive graffiti at the playpark adjacent to Challen Street at Amblehurst Green. We went to check the area whilst out on patrol but were happy to find some joyful children's drawings made using chalk which is a non-permanent material and has since been washed away by the rain that we have seen following the summer heatwaves.

Fly Tipping & Litter

Fly tipping around the parish

August saw less fly tipping within the parish than in July but sadly any fly tipping is not acceptable. There has been an increase in building materials and commercial waste.

Anti-Social Behaviour/Damage

Former Barclays Bank

Sadly, this building continues to suffer from neglect and remains inadequately secured against damage and unauthorised access. This is despite previous remedial works having been undertaken and repeated requests being made to the owners to implement further proactive and preventative security measures while the building remains undeveloped.

Following the recent vandalism in which the front doors were smashed, we attended the site alongside PCSO Tom Fontyn to assess the damage and discuss concerns regarding potential ongoing access to the building, particularly via the rear stairwell and roof area.

Attempts have subsequently been made to contact the owners to raise concerns about the current condition and security of the property and to encourage further action. However, at the time of writing, no response has been received.

The continued deterioration of the building and the lack of appropriate security measures remain a concern, not only due to the risk of further criminal damage and anti-social behaviour, but also because of the potential safety risks associated with unauthorised access to the site. We will continue to monitor the situation and pursue engagement with the owners where possible.

Sadly, the Station Road Gardens volunteers reported that, once again, the wooden dividers from the compost heaps had been removed and thrown around the gardens and surrounding grounds. Even more distressingly, a memorial plaque was ripped from the ground and discarded nearby.

This ongoing vandalism and lack of respect for a valued community space continues to have a significant impact on the small number of dedicated volunteers who work tirelessly to maintain and improve the gardens for the benefit of residents and visitors alike. Each incident requires additional time and effort to repair the damage, diverting resources away from positive projects and improvements.

Despite these challenges, the volunteers remain committed to preserving the gardens, and their hard work and resilience deserve recognition. It is disappointing that a community asset, maintained largely through volunteer effort, continues to be subjected to such needless acts of damage and disrespect.

Noise & Litter Complaints at Station Road

Complaints were received by the Parish & District Councils regarding anti-social behaviour by a group meeting on the steps of Wilkins House in Station Road. Noise issues and an increase in litter were reported. We spoke with PCSO Fontyn about the issues and additional patrols were conducted in the area by both him and us. Local businesses were also visited.

- Provide a highly visible and reassuring uniformed patrolling presence.
- Provide an effective eyes and ears service aimed at reducing the fear of crime and improving quality of life.
- Work alongside the Police and submit reports regarding drug use, criminal damage and anti-social behaviour.
