What matters to you



We have listened to you and the concerns you have raised through surveys, community consultations and analysing crime trends. Using this data, we have created the following Uppingham Town priorities that the Dedicated Neighbourhood Team will focus their efforts on:

Priority 1: Road Safety. You said: Speeding vehicles on Rutland roads is a priority you want us to address, specifically the lack of adherence to 30mph zones. What we are going to do: We will

complete high visibility patrols of hotspot areas with partner agencies and deal proactively with offenders with a view to providing suitable advice or action where required.

Priority 2: Drugs. You Said: Drug dealing as well as drug use in the area. We are going to do develop our intelligence picture around those who commit this type of crime so we that we can effectively target our resources in the right areas, at the right time, with the aim of deterring, disrupting and bringing offenders to justice.

Priority 3: Anti-Social Behaviour. You said: Specific issues of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) concerning individuals in the community, 'nuisance neighbours' and irresponsible dog ownership / walking is an area you want us to focus on. What we are going to do: We will provide a frequent high visibility policing presence, as part of a localised operation around Road Safety, to the affected areas with marked vehicle patrols and regular monitoring. We will deploy the speed gun device and deal with offenders robustly where appropriate. We will also continue to work with partner agencies, such as the Road Safety Partnership mobile speed camera van, to identify areas of concern and request deployment of that resource. We will then continue to publish the enforcement statistics on the Neighbourhood Link messaging service.

This month your local team have been incredibly busy managing ongoing caseloads, as well as providing extensive support to our response policing colleagues across Leicestershire and Rutland. We have also ensured that our front enquiry desks remain open to visitors.

The summer is traditionally very busy across all spectrums of policing, and this summer has been no different. In relation to drugs following a local resident a vehicle was stopped having just left a local car park. A small quantity of drug was found in the vehicle and the occupant was arrested. He was also charged without driving without a valid license and having no insurance.

We continue to work on supporting our neighbourhoods through positive engagement at our prescribed beat surgeries and providing a visible presence by patrolling our priority locations in relation to Anti-Social Behaviour and hosting the Summer Safer Community Team in the town.



Crime Trends and Prevention Advice

Unfortunately, across Rutland we have seen an increase in burglary and rural crime this month. Please be reassured that these incidents are investigated and we pursue all reasonable and proportionate lines of enquiry, with CID detectives where appropriate. Please help us to help you, by doing what you can to deter, detect, deny and delay any potential offenders. This can be as simple as installing additional locks, lighting and alarms, CCTV and doorbell camera. This is especially important as the darker nights start to creeping in.

Please report suspicious activity to the Police by calling 101 for non-emergencies, or 999 if there is a crime taking place or an emergency.
