## What matters to you

- Anti Social Behaviour —You have told us that Anti-Social behaviour causes you concern. This can be things like excessive noise, parties, smoking drugs and more. We will be working with partners to ensure we can tackle these issues and prevent them occurring again.
- Motor vehicle crime—You told us that you were concerned about vehicle crime. This can be theft of motor vehicles or theft from motor vehicles, this also includes theft of tools from vans and theft of catalytic convertors.
- Road Safety—You have told us that Road Safety is a priority, this includes things like Speeding, Insurance,
   MOT and driving offences.

## What have we done #yousaidwedid

- Anti Social Behaviour—The local neighbourhood team conduct regular patrols in highlighted problem areas.
  - Officers will advertise on our social media channels when they are out and about patrolling We record all ASB on our shared system with Harborough District Council and together we will do what we can to reduce problems and provide you with the satisfaction.
  - We continue to encourage you to report concerns and locations to us, we need this information to conduct more targeted patrols.
- Road Safety—the local beat team regularly conduct speed checks and deal with any traffic issues that are
  reported on the beat. We endeavour to update via social media or Neighbourhood Link when we complete
  these duties.

## What have we done #yousaidwedid

#### **Vehicle Recovery:**

On 6th July after reports of a parked vehicle causing an nuisance on Fretter Close in Broughton Astley the local beat officer has attended and recovered the vehicle for being SORN whilst parked on a road. It also had no MOT and was taken by our recovery team. If you have any problem vehicles you can report these to the police via our website.



#### **Speeding Checks:**

On 8th July PC 4175 and PC 1035 completed speed checks at the following locations:

- Station Road, Broughton Astley
- Coventry Road, Broughton Astley
- Main Street, Frolesworth

It was great to see vehicles following the speed limit and we will continue to complete speeding checks. If you have any speeding issues you want us to look at please let us know!


### **Speeding Checks:**

Further speeding checks were completed on the 18th of August by PCSO Brown and PCSO Goodall. Speed checks completed on Station Road in Broughton Astley.



#### **Safer Summer Streets Update:**

PC FARR and PC GINNS completed hi-vis patrols around Broughton Astley on 19th August regarding the Police Safer Summer Streets
Campaign. This campaign is utilised to address and target any ASB and retail crime. This is across the entire Harborough and Wigston Policing Area. Whilst completing these patrols, PC FARR and PC GINNS attended local shops in Broughton Astley, dropping of retail crime booklets to assist officers in retail crime investigations.



#### **ASB Patrols:**

Reports of ASB related issues on the green space area known locally as "The Dip" which is situated off the back of Fallow Close, Burnside Road & Millbrook Drive. The local beat team completed patrols around this area and will continue to complete checks on this location to identify and deter anyone from committing ASB.



## !!Health and Safety Advice!!

With the good weather approaching, please make sure to be aware and advise your children not to swim in any open water, ponds or lakes. And not to trespass onto any land to go in the water.

We had reports last year of people trespassing onto private land to swim in ponds and lakes. This is a serious safety risk and can cause issues if someone becomes stuck in the water or goes into shock due to the cold temperatures.

The local beat team will complete patrols in these areas and anyone found trespassing the land to swim will be dealt with accordingly.

Think about what you post on social media while you're away



Reconsider leaving notes for the postman about where to leave parcels



Fit sheds, garages and any outbuildings with locks



Look at your property from the outside to review what can be seen
