#YouSaid - What matters to you

Below are our beat priorities -

Priority:

Dealing with the anti-social behaviour involving the illegal use of e-scooters and off-road bikes across the ward.

Update:

We continue to target antisocial behaviour connected to e-scooters. In the early part of the month, we conducted Op Pedalfast on the The Rally park, resulting in us seizing 10 illegal e-bikes/e-scooters in only a few hours. This work also led to a male being stopped, searched and arrested for possession of class B drugs within intent to supply. He was charged with four offences, namely dangerous driving, possession of an offensive weapon in a private place, driving without insurance, and driving otherwise in accordance with a driving license. The drug supply investigation is ongoing.

Priority:

Dealing with the production of class B drugs on the area, in addition to tackling the use and supply of both class A and B drugs in areas where this affects the local community.

Update:

This month we continued to keep the pressure on those who seek to distribute drugs on the Fosse. As well as the male we arrested on the Rally for drug offences (see ASB/e-scooter priority update), PC Phil was also successful later in February in sniffing out a cannabis grow, complete with two males found to be in the UK illegally. They were both charged and remanded into custody and will likely be deported upon release. We will continue to disrupt criminal who produce, possess or supply drugs of all kinds.

Priority:

Targeting those on the ward who commit anti-social behaviour, particularly where this is connected to drinking or drug use in public. This includes in open spaces such as The Rally, Glenfield Road East and Hinckley Road near the junction with Kirby Road.

Update:

In addition to conducting Op Pedalfast on The Rally in February, we also continued to patrol Glenfield Road East and connected areas to deal with any anti-social behaviour connected to public drug use or street drinking. We have established a good working relationship with local businesses and occupants, and have invested time in working with partners to try to 'design out' the problem at the location, so watch this space.

What we are doing



Op Pedalfast at The Rally Park

Welcome to the February edition of the Fosse Neighbourhood Team Newsletter.

As I mentioned in the January newsletter, the beat team have started conducting a policing op on The Rally Park. This op is called Pedalfast, which consists of officers stopping and seizing illegal bikes and e-scooters.

The Rally is frequently used for commute into the city, especially for delivery drivers to which many of them use e-bikes which have been modified to enable them to go faster. On the day the beat team with help of other officers from other beats seized 10 of these illegal bikes and scooters. This is a good start for the beat team and we aim to carry out these ops as much as we can between the other work that we do.

Within February the team also seized 3 cannabis grows on The Fosse. This is through checks on addresses that we have done and intel that we have received.

There have been 4 arrested persons around these cannabis grows to which all 4 were charged and remanded. Over 350 plants were seized totalling £350,000. The selective licensing team served probation notices on the landlords.

PC Sally has a running Problem Management Plan which is a targeted operation for Glenfield Road East in regards to drug taking and general ASB at the bus stop close to Flora Street and the surrounding area. She has formed a good working partnership with fellow organisations involved and has recently conducted a patch walk to talk about what can be done by all involved to help minimise the issues. With plenty of patrolling and stop checks over the last few weeks this has really seen a drop in ASB but realistically a long term plan needs to be put into place which is what we are all working towards.

Around West Leicester there has been a spike in vehicle thefts, theft from vehicles and burglaries. We always give advice around securing your property, not leaving items on display in vehicles and locking your vehicles too. You'd be surprised how many people leave their cars running to make deliveries and 30 seconds later someone is driving off in it!

So, a gentle reminder of the above. Now the weather is looking more promising and we start leaving doors and windows open, please please please be mindful that these burglaries and thefts do happen, so to protect what is yours.
