### FRAUD warnings

Every music and sports fan knows that often, tickets for gigs, festivals, big games and tournaments sell out very quickly. To avoid disappointment this summer, you might turn to social media, online marketplaces or fan forums to look for tickets. You may get lucky, or you may get scammed, which is even more disappointing as not only do you miss out on tickets, you also lose your hard-earned money.

In a ticket scam, the seller tells you they'll post or email the tickets as soon as you've transferred the money to their bank account. But when you try to contact them after nothing's arrived, they've disappeared into thin air. Chances are, dozens of other people have fallen victim to the same fraud.

We enjoyed two glorious days engaging with many visitors who took the time to share their thoughts and concerns through our Resident Voice surveys. Following concerns raised about speeding on ASH ROAD outside CUDDINGTON PRIMARY SCHOOL, I carried out speed monitoring this week. The highest recorded speed was 24 mph. Police warning letters issued to drivers exceeding the 20 mph limit. Whilst in the area, a driver was politely asked to safely relocate their vehicle, which was obstructing the whole footpath.

### PATROLS

Residents of FERN WAY met with CWAC Councillor EDWARDS, the WEAVERHAM Parish Clerk, a CWAC Enforcement Officer, and myself to discuss parking concerns within their close and explore potential solutions. Further meetings will be arranged in due course to continue addressing the issue.

A concerned member of the public attended the PCSO office at The Lighthouse Church Centre to report ongoing issues involving a motorbike being ridden dangerously in the Well Lane / Farm Road area. The motorbike is reportedly very loud and is being ridden between 5:00 PM and 6:00 PM on the public highway by an unknown male rider without a helmet, often carrying a male or female passenger also without helmets. Patrols were carried out in the area but no trace of the motorbike or individuals was found. If you have any information regarding those involved, please contact me
