

#### **Ward Priorities**

#### 1- Violence Related Offences

**Action taken-** To identify areas on the ward where people feel unsafe. Conducted reassurance patrols, weapon sweeps in open spaces, street briefings and work with the Council to improve areas where people feel unsafe.

**Results -** Multiple stop and searches conducted as a result from targeted patrols with positive outcomes.

#### 2- Robbery/Theft

**Action taken-** High Vis & Plain clothes patrols, reviewing crime data to identify hotspots to target volume crime venues. Work in partnership with Business Crime Reduction.

**Results –** Proactive interventions by officer in Pegler Square targeting shoplifting, multiple suspects detained and issued with banning letters. Op. Zoridan, officers conducted visits to local business and shops.


#### 3- Motor Vehicle Crime

Action taken- To carry out patrols across the ward at varied times to try and detect and deter criminal activity.

**Results –** Proactive patrols to targeted areas, one moped recovered.


#### Robbery - Last 365 Days






### **Heat Maps**

### **Good News Stories**

Your Safer Neighbourhood Team targeted patrols around Sutcliffe Park, Pegler Square, Weigall Road and surrounding areas for anti-social behaviour which include drug dealing and drug consumption, shoplifting and VAWG. This is still an ongoing issue that we take very seriously, and we will continue to target over the coming weeks by undertaking proactive high-visibility and plain clothes patrols.

Officers arrested one male for breach of tag and conducted two stop and searches for drugs, Community Resolution Issued for Possession of Class B Cannabis.

One Charge for Racially Aggravated Harassment and Breach of CBO.

Multiple proactive interventions for shoplifting and ASB at Pegler Square with warnings issued

Officers have assisted with interviews, wanted offenders' arrests and Mental health warrants.

Op Zoridan, officers deployed around Greenwich Over the three days, managed to visit 52 venues with Partners from LA and Licensing and Apple.

10 arrests made, drugs, handling, wanted offenders and seized large amount of drugs, property and countless mobile phones.

Within the last week officers have in focus Autumn Nights, an initiative to tackle the seasonal increases in criminal offences over the Halloween and Fireworks periods. Violence with Injury, Theft, Robbery and Burglary historically increase during the period around Halloween, Bonfire night and school half term.

- •Focus on ASB around peak times such as Halloween and Fireworks Night.
- •Be a visible and reassuring presence to the communities during the darker days.
- •Protect and safeguard all females on the Ward with regards to VAWG crimes.

The team joined the fun with Kidbrooke Community Hub (GCDA) and created a spooky Halloween display on our main entrance for the Kidbrooke Halloween Hunt.

Officers have attended multiple events and Drop-in Surgeries on the ward and deployed for aid to demonstrations and protests around London, we continue to support neighbouring ward officers when requested.
