You Said	We did
General ASB, congregating youths e-scooters and bikes.	A house identified as being owned by East Midlands Housing has been issued a notice in relation to a child from the address riding a motocross bike up and down the street. At Johns Court youths were being anti-social on bikes in the precinct. Youth workers arrived and engaged with the young people. BDC have funded youth workers in the precinct one night a week.
Burglaries both residential and commercial.	See below
Road Safety including car cruising, anti-social driving and vehicle safety has been highlighted by the public as an issue.	A report was received of a vehicle in Johns Court Car Park doing 'doughnuts' – CCTV at the location was viewed and the vehicle details obtained, The driver was issued a section 59.

News

Storm Goretti arrived in some places last month and The Met Office issued an Amber Warning for heavy snow and strong winds. We received a large number of calls about vehicles succumbing to the weather and leaving occupants stranded. However, others including myself were left bitterly disappointed after Storm 'Forgetti' missed us entirely.

Officers are investigating a burglary in Blaby where the keys to the occupants vehicle were stolen, the car was taken from the driveway and barely got more than 100yds before crashing into the front porch area of a nearby property. The car was returned to its owner. The investigation continues with CCTV, house to house and forensics.

A male from Whetstone has been charged with drink driving after blowing over 2 1/2 times the legal limit at the roadside. Officers arrested the male just off the Blaby bypass after he had stopped the vehicle on the roundabout. The male is due to appear in court later this month.

Two brothers responsible for a significant series of burglaries across Leicestershire, the East Midlands and Wales have now been jailed. Among the many areas targeted by Daniel and Terrence Casey was **Whetstone**, where one of the early offences took place during a spree that saw homes specifically selected for high-value items including cars, cash and jewellery. Officers reported that, in the days following their initial offences in Birstall, Loughborough and Mountsorrel, Daniel Casey expanded his activity into several local communities — notably **Leicester, Oadby, Whetstone and Hinckley** — forcing entry into homes and causing damage while stealing property. This Whetstone incident formed part of a wider pattern of **37 linked burglaries** across multiple counties between late 2024 and early 2025, ultimately leading to the brothers' arrest and conviction. Both were sentenced at Leicester Crown Court, with Daniel receiving 112 months and Terrence 42 months, alongside Serious Crime Prevention Orders to take effect upon their release.

Our beat unfortunately is still being targeted, however the beat team have been out on burglary patrols, keeping a close eye on the areas affected by recent break-ins. For those burglaries that we have had, work is ongoing to conduct CCTV and house to house enquiries to identify suspects and any vehicles involved. If you see anything suspicious, please report it to Leicestershire Police via 101, or use 999 in an emergency if a crime is in progress.
