Man jailed for assault

A 38 year old man from Wellingborough was found guilty at Northampton Crown Court of non-fatal strangulation, causing actual bodily harm and assault on a police officer. In August, he was sentenced to four years in prison, and ordered not to contact his ex-partner either directly or through a third party, not to attend her home and instructed to pay £228 court costs.

Community surgeries

Your team regularly hold community surgeries which give you the chance to meet your PCSOs in person, and discuss any crime concerns you may have. Details of these surgeries are advertised in advance and you can see upcoming events on your local area page <u>here</u>.

Vehicle crimes

Officers from your neighbourhood team have been made aware from residents of recent vehicle crimes. If you have been a victim of vehicle crime, please report it to us. Likewise, if you have evidence that could assist our investigation, please share it with us. That includes doorbell footage.

There are some simple but effective things you can do to help protect your vehicle:

- Park your car in a garage or driveway if possible, or on a busy, well-lit road.
 Choose a ParkMark® accredited public car park wherever possible
- Never leave anything on display in your car. The cost to repair damage to the vehicle will usually exceed the value of the theft
- Drivers of some Toyota and Honda vehicles and some 4 x 4's should install measures to deter theft of catalytic converts e.g <u>Catloc | Catalytic</u> Convertor Theft Protection

Op Snap

This scheme allows the public to submit dashcam evidence online regarding road offences within 14 days of the offence. The team **can only accept video footage.** They will then prosecute the driver with a notice of intended prosecution.

In August 2025, there were 298 submissions to Op Snap. You can submit your footage here <u>Northamptonshire Police</u> Operation Snap.

Anyone who submits footage via Operation Snap can find out the outcome of their submission by following the link on their confirmation email which will take them to a monthly update.
