



June crime and incident statistics

Here are details of incidents on the beat over the last month: Thefts – 1 Burglaries – 1 Criminal damage – 2 Assault (including domestic related assault) – 7 Road Traffic Collisions / Road Traffic incidents – 27 As you can see acquisitive crime figures are low but there has been a higher demand on your local police in relation to incidents on the road network.

Road safety / policing the roads

The Rural South beat team are focussing on reducing casualties, reducing anti-social use of the roads and denying criminals use of the roads. As mentioned in the previous newsletter we have put together a number of small operations targeting the areas that see the most issues. An number of complaints have come through to us in relation to the very popular 'bike night' in Ashby Folville that takes place every fortnight. In response to this we have met with the organiser and the pub landlord to discuss our approach. They will make efforts to alleviate the parking problem as well as erecting signage to warn the riders to behave. In addition to enforcement operations with assistance of the Roads policing Unit I have also adopted a different approach.
