#YouSaid - What matters to you

We have listened to your concerns and prioritised the following:

Priority 1: Parking Concerns – Bennion Road

You Said: Residents raised concerns about dangerous, inconsiderate, and illegal parking on Bennion Road, particularly during football training sessions. We have received multiple complaints highlighting safety risks and disruption to the local community.

Our Action: During the month of May we increased our presence in the area of Maplewell Drive and Pinewood Close. PCSO Jaik and PCSO Kurtis have issued 5 parking tickets for obstruction of footpaths. The local team continue to monitor the issue during match days and work with local civil enforcement officers when opportunity arise. Posters have been displayed in the DMU grounds advising visitors clubs of the enforcement actions if their vehicle is illegally parked.

Priority 2: Anti-Social Behaviour – Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre

You Said: Retailers and security staff at Beaumont Leys Shopping Centre reported ongoing issues with anti-social behaviour involving groups of youths.

Our Action: The Problem Management Plan continues to show positive results. The local beat team, supported by the Safer Streets Team, has carried out high-visibility patrols around the shopping centre. Officers engaged positively with local youths and store staff, helping to reinforce community relationships and promote a safe, welcoming environment for shoppers and businesses.

During May, we did see a spike in anti-social behaviour which included some thefts from stores. A number of warning letters have gone out to parents and the young persons getting involved spoken to. Going into June thanks to action from Beaumont Security, Police and shops, anti-social behaviour is showing signs of reduction.

Priority 3: Heathley Park

You Said: Residents expressed concerns about an increase in anti-social behaviour, residential burglaries, and thefts from motor vehicles in the Heathley Park area.

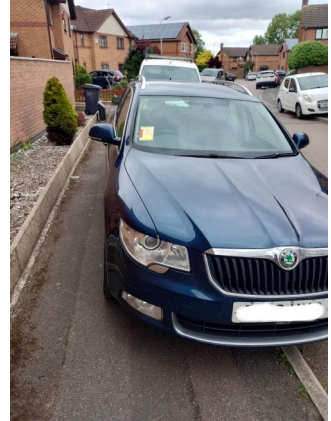
Our Action: The beat team has continued to conduct regular high-visibility patrols across the area. These proactive efforts are designed to provide community reassurance, deter criminal behaviour, and respond quickly to emerging concerns.

Local News During May



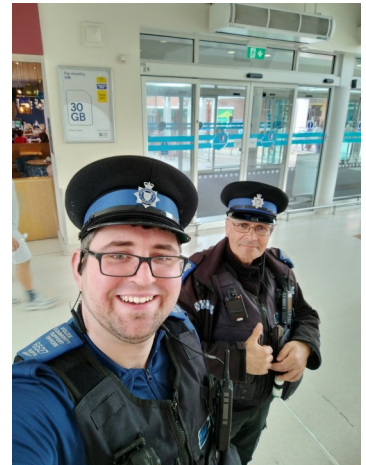
- The neighbourhood team has been busy this May with patrols, covering response, beat engagement events, assisting with scenes and helping out with CCTV enquiries.

Some were stealing items and being verbally abusive towards security and staff members. Reports and statements done, arrests made and we had charges for some offences brought to those involved.

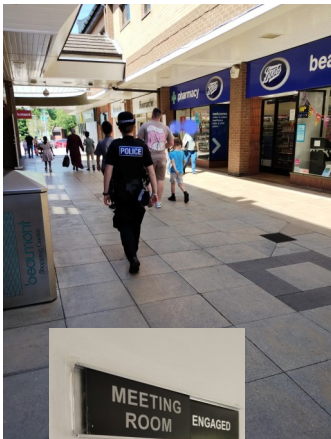


- PC Tony has been getting involved with our Council ASB team and done a number of visits to addresses and attended meetings to try resolve longstanding issues with struggling families.

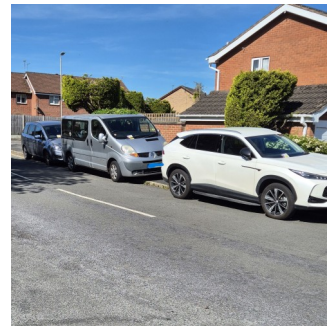
- PCSO Telat and PCSO Kurtis have carried out beat surgeries at the Beaumont Shopping centre and another at the Astill Lodge Shops.
