Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe Ward

Officers from Kidbrooke Park SNT and Kidbrooke Village & Sutcliffe SNT were on foot patrol on their ward and made aware of a male who was exposing himself in a public place. Officers attended the location and by carrying out an area search and engaging with further members of the public, were able to locate this male over a quarter of a mile away now in a green space where he was subsequently arrested. The team would like to thank the public for their assistance in this matter, and this demonstrates how valuable your information and interaction with our team can be.

The Ward Team reassured the local community at the Kidbrooke Carnival with Pride, supporting this great community event at Pegler Square. SNT Officers in collaboration with the MET LGBT+ Community Liaison Officer provided advice and information from our stand at the event.

Officers identified a vehicle fly tipping on the ward through CCTV, investigative work and a range of resources. Following this, whilst carrying out enquires, two vehicles were seized and the suspects arrested and remanded in custody.

Two traffic operations in the area over the last week resulted in 30 vehicles stopped with some involved in suspicious activity. This was targeted at Kidbrooke Park Road and adjacent roads.

We have held a well-received workshop at Wingfield primary school as a way of early intervention for Year 6 pupils, who are most susceptible to peer pressure and criminal exploitation by gangs. We briefed the pupils on the dangers of knife crime, drugs, ASB awareness and general safety.

Officers did a walk around Sutcliffe Park with The Friends of Sutcliffe Park volunteers, we identified hotspots where ASB, Vandalism and crime. SNT patrols Sutcliffe Park on a regular basis in plain clothes and uniform, reassuring this area of the ward where most residents spend their free time engaged in a variety of activities.

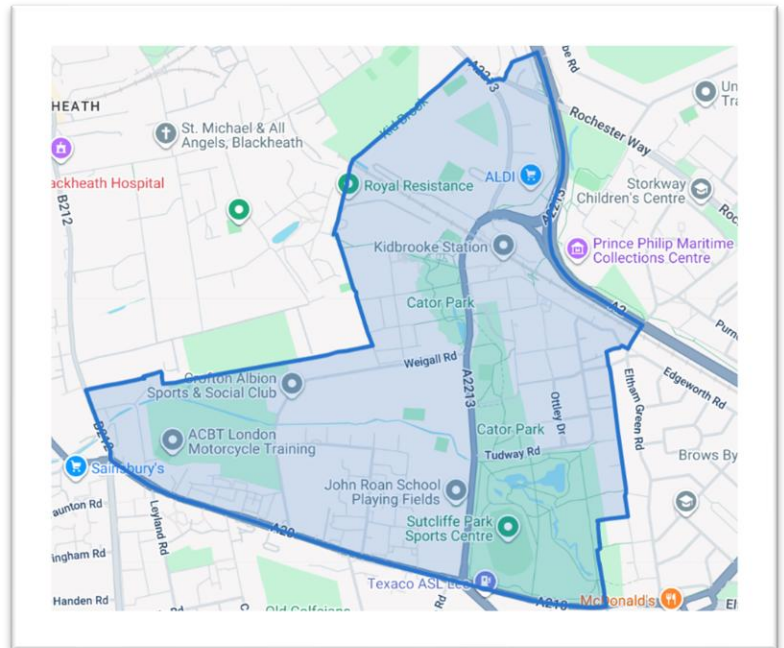
The Ward Panel was held on the **08/07/2026** at The Kidbrooke Village Community Centre and members had the opportunity to talk about the emerging issues on the ward. The second quarter crime statistics were presented and discussed. A copy of these can be found attached to this Newsletter for your awareness. Emerging issues raised in the meeting directly to local officers were:

- * ASB in Cator Park, Pegler square and Sutcliffe Park.
- * Rise in parcel theft at multiple locations on the ward.
- * Bike Theft and shoplifting.

The new ward priorities for the third quarter are:

- 1- Shoplifting**
- 2- Residential burglary**
- 3- Anti social behaviour**

The next meeting will take place on 21 October 2026 at the Kidbrooke Village Community Centre.
