Is your teenager risking their future driving record by using an escooter?

There is a long list of offences that could be committed by escooter riders in Warwickshire. These include:

- No insurance - £300 fine 6 points on licence
- No driving licence - £100 fine 3 points on licence
- Using mobile phone or other handheld device whilst riding - £200 fine and 6 points on licence.
- Riding through a red light - £100 fine 3 points on licence
- Riding on the pavement £50 fine.

National HGV road safety project 'Operation Tramline'

Three plain white HGV tractor units have been loaned out to police forces by Highways England to help improve safety for drivers on the strategic road network in England. The contract for the unmarked HGV cab national project aims to change driver behaviour and discourage non-compliance.

The elevated position of the HGV cabs allows police forces to drive alongside vehicles to film any unsafe driver behaviour taking place. Since the initiative began Operation Tramline has stopped 9,674 vehicles resulting in 10,926 offences with 11,338 interventions being dispensed.

Top three offences detected through Operation Tramline are:

1. Mobile phone use
2. Seat belt offences
3. Driver not in proper control

Contacting the police

The police encourage all residents to report any policing issues directly to us, as a direct report from a resident is logged onto our database and builds evidence for resources to be applied to issues.

Social media conversations do not contribute to this important data base and reports made by emails to others often delay the recording, action or update on what the police are actively doing to try to deal with incidents, reduce crime and tackle anti-social behaviour. We would like to signpost and encourage the below ways to best contact us:

Points of contact

Emergency 999 — if life is at risk, people are injured, offenders are nearby or a crime is in progress.

Reporting online - This is the preferred method to contact police and report any non-emergency issues that do not require an immediate response. This also includes reporting non-emergency collisions and anti-social behaviour. Online reporting is available 24/7 and can be accessed at

#TicketFraud Spot the signs of ticket fraud.

It is always safest to book tickets through official sellers that are members of the self-regulatory body the Society of Ticket Agents and Retailers (STAR), as anything else could be a scam.

- **How to spot ticket fraud**
You see an offer for a ticket online, in an email or in a message/DM.
- You're offered tickets for a high-demand or sold-out event at a "too good to be true" price.
- You're asked to pay by bank transfer only and not via the secure payment methods recommended by reputable online retailers
- You see a website that looks similar to that of a genuine organisation but there are subtle changes to the URL.
- You're told that a customer representative will be arranged to meet outside the venue.
